Re: USA v Erie County et al.

As you are aware, I site visited the Erie County Holding Center (ECHC) and the Erie County Correctional Facility (ECCF) during October 20, 2016. Ronald Schoelerman, LMSW (Director of Intensive Adult Mental Health Services) accompanied me throughout this site visit.

The Stipulated Order of Dismissal

The most significant progress re: the provisions of the Stipulated Order of Dismissal since the April 2016 site visit have included the achievement of sustained compliance in one additional provision ((7) Documentation and Record-keeping) and one provision that is newly found to be in substantial compliance. Appendix IX lists the 48 provisions that are now in sustained compliance. The provision newly found to be in sustained compliance is bolded in Appendix IX.

All of the provisions of the Stipulated Order of Dismissal that were assessed to be in substantial compliance during the previous site visit have remained in substantial compliance except for the previously referenced provision that is now in sustained compliance. Appendix VIII lists these provisions. A total of four (4) provisions are now in substantial compliance. The following provision is newly found to be in substantial compliance:

8.f. The County will continue to develop and implement a policy and procedure regarding psychotropic medication non-compliance that meets the standard of care.

Appendix III lists the three (3) provisions of this Stipulated Order that remain in partial compliance.

My previous report included the following:

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Funding to significantly expand the ECCF mental health office space via a renovation project was approved by the Legislature on September 11, 2015. This space is needed in order to more adequately provide needed mental health services to inmates at ECCF. The County reports that the DPW is in the process of drafting a contract for an A/E consultant to come on board. Preliminary drawings were completed in 2014, so the design phase should be completed relatively quickly. The County anticipates a March/April 2016 start to this project, with an expected duration of 5-6 weeks.

Construction was anticipated to begin in about six months. I discussed with staff specific design issues such the need for an alarm system in each office, large windows in the office doors and construction of a large multipurpose room.

The electronic medical record implementation process continues improve but remains a work in progress.

The leadership exhibited by Mr. Schoelerman, Dr. Antonius, and Dr. Coggins remains impressive. The relationship between the Department of Mental Health and the University of Buffalo's Department of Psychiatry continues to be crucial in improving the mental health services.
