This cause came on for hearing on August 10, 1964 on plaintiffs' application for preliminary injunction and after hearing some evidence the Court referred the matter to a conference to be held by the Court with counsel on a later date.

Pursuant to this reference a conference was held on August 24th, 1964 at which the Court and Counsel for the parties were present.

At the conference after discussion of the facts counsel were informed that after careful consideration it appeared to the Court that the plaintiffs were entitled to a preliminary injunction as prayed for but that because of the short time remaining before the opening of the Jefferson Parish schools for the 1964-65 session and the many problems involved an order entered at that time which would require the Jefferson Parish School Board to discontinue the operation of a compulsory bi-racial school system in Jefferson Parish, Louisiana beginning with the 1964-65 term of school could not be complied with without seriously disrupting the school system to the detriment of the pupils of both races.

The Court further informed counsel that instead of entering an order at that time the Court would on or about

January 15, 1965 enter an order granting the preliminary injunction and requiring the Jefferson Parish School Board to submit to the Court on or about March 15, 1965 a plan for the desegregation of the public schools, primary and secondary, of Jefferson Parish.

It is now ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED, that effective with the opening of the 1965-66 school term the Jefferson Parish School Board and Paul J. Solis, Superintendent, their agents, representatives, employees and successors, and all persons in active concert and participation with them be, and they are, preliminarily enjoined from continuing to operate a compulsory bi-racial school system in Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, and

It is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED, that the Jefferson Parish School Board and Paul J. Solis, Superintendent, submit to the Court and file in this record, not later than March 31st, 1965, a plan which will provide for the discontinuance of the compulsory bi-racial school system in Jefferson Parish, Louisiana.
