Plaintiffs, Jesus Christ Prison Ministry, Daniel Leffel, Marvin Salinas, and
Daniel Marchy (“Plaintiffs”), by and through counsel of record, Kevin T. Snider, Pacific
Justice Institute, and Defendants, California Department of Corrections and
Rehabilitation (“CDCR”), by James E. Tilton, its Secretary, and Defendants Woodford

1 and Adams, in their official capacities, have entered into a settlement agreement
2 (“Settlement Agreement”), release, and voluntary dismissal with prejudice pursuant to
3 Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(a)(1)(ii). (Clerk’s Record (CR) 68.)

4 The Settlement Agreement provides that CDCR will implement a Pilot
5 Program at the California Substance Abuse Treatment Facility at Corcoran (“SATF”)
6 which establishes policy and procedure for the inspection and issuance of religious audio
7 media from religious organizations that are not departmentally approved inmate Package
8 Vendors. (CR 68 at 3:18-24.) Appendix One, a copy of the approved Pilot Program, was
9 inadvertently omitted from the filing of the Settlement Agreement.

10 Accordingly, the parties supplement the record with Attachment 1, a copy
11 of the approved Pilot Program, which is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth in
12 the Settlement Agreement.

TEMPORARY OPERATIONAL PROCEDURE

Title: Access to Religious Audio Media

Affected Areas: Receiving and Release, Investigative Services Unit and
Institution Chaplains

Purpose: Establish policies and procedures for the inspection and issuance of religious audio media from religious organizations that are not departmentally approved Inmate Package Vendors.

Methods

Inmates wishing to possess audio media from Jesus Christ Prison Ministry (JCPM) shall submit a purchase order containing the requested funds or may request a copy at no charge based upon a claim of indigency as may be permitted by JCPM. The method for approval of purchases and donations is entirely up to JCPM.

Once per month, JCPM will ship all inmate orders of audio media, to the California Substance Abuse Treatment Facility and State Prison (CSATF). Packages shall not designate a specific chaplain's name but be addressed to the attention of "Religious Programs." Shipments will take place on a date agreed upon between CSATF and JCPM, and shall contain all inmate purchases and donations for the month, including a manifest identifying the inmate recipients by name and CDCR number.

Cassette tapes and compact discs (CD) shall not be designated for any specific inmate unless only one copy of a particular product was requested. In this manner it shall remain unknown to JCPM which inmate will receive a particular copy of a tape or CD.

The designated chaplain shall be responsible for randomly reviewing any of a number of tapes and CDs in order to verify valid religious content. Once satisfied the audio media contains only appropriate religious material, the package and inmate manifest are forwarded to the CSATF Investigative Services Unit (ISU) for informational and investigative purposes. The institution Chaplain shall have five-days to complete this process.

CSATF ISU shall review the audio media for any hidden files or recordings and forward this material to Receiving and Release (R&R) for educating and issuance to inmates and inclusion on property cards. ISU shall have five-days to complete this process.

R&R shall process religious audio media in the same manner as that received through inmate packages. Final disposition of excess tapes and CDs shall follow policy established in Department Operations Manual Section 54030.12.2.
