The Pima County Recorder F. Ann Rodriguez responds to Plaintiffs' Motion for Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunction as follows:

The Pima County Recorder agrees with Plaintiffs that electronic signature gathering for initiative petitions should be temporarily allowed during the pendency of COVID-19 restrictions imposed by the State of Arizona. There does not appear to be any technological reason why the Secretary of State could not implement such a Electronic signature gathering is authorized under Arizona law for process. candidates seeking statewide and legislative offices, A.R.S. § 16-315(E), for

candidates seeking municipal, county and precinct committeemen offices, A.R.S. §
16-317, and for candidates seeking federal offices, A.R.S. § 16-318. The Secretary of
State has implemented A.R.S. §§ 16-315(E) and 16-318 with her E-Qual internet
portal. Since the portal already can verify registered Arizona voters in signing for
candidates, it should be able to verify registered Arizona voters in signing for
initiatives.

If the Court is inclined to order such relief and such process is implemented, the Pima County Recorder would not disqualify any signatures for the reason that they were collected using E-Qual when she conducts her certification pursuant to A.R.S. § 19-121.02.
