CONSENT DECREE

Introduction

Plaintiff Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (hereinafter the "Commission") has instituted this action alleging that RadioShack Corporation (hereinafter the "Defendant") discriminated against Jessica Polk in violation of Section 703(a) of Title VII, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e-2(a).

For purposes of settlement and compromise only, the parties have advised the Court that they wish to resolve the instant controversy without the expense, delay, and burden of further litigation;

THEREFORE, it is the finding of this Court, made on the pleadings and on the record as a whole and upon agreement of the parties, that: (i) this Court has jurisdiction over the parties to and the subject matter of this action, (ii) the requirements of the Title VII will be carried out by the implementation of this Decree, (iii) this Decree is intended to and does resolve all matters in controversy in this lawsuit among the parties, and (iv) the terms of this Decree constitute a fair and equitable settlement of all issues in this lawsuit.



IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED as follows:

I. General Provisions

- 1. This Decree, being entered with the consent of the parties for purposes of settlement, shall not constitute an adjudication on the merits of this lawsuit and shall not be construed as an admission by Defendant of any violation of Title VII or any executive order, law, rule or regulation dealing with or in connection with sexual harassment or sex discrimination in the workplace.
- 2. Defendant shall not discriminate against its employees with respect to hiring, promotion, firing, compensation, or other terms, conditions or privileges of employment on the basis of sex. Defendant maintains that it has not discriminated against its employees with respect to hiring, promotion, firing, compensation, or other terms, conditions or privileges of employment on the basis of sex.
- 3. Defendant shall not discriminate or retaliate against any person because he or she:

 (a) has opposed any practices alleged in this lawsuit as unlawful under Title VII; (b) has participated in any investigation by the Commission connected with or leading up to this lawsuit; (c) has participated in this lawsuit; or (d) has benefitted or will benefit in any way as a result of this Consent Decree. Defendant maintains that it has not discriminated or retaliated against any person because he or she: (a) has opposed any practices alleged in this lawsuit as unlawful under Title VII; (b) has participated in any investigation by the Commission connected with or leading up to this lawsuit; (c) has participated in this lawsuit; or (d) has benefitted or will benefit in any way as a result of this Consent Decree.

4. Defendant agrees to never employ Earnette A. Smith, the individual alleged to have harassed Jessica Polk, in any stores owned or operated by Defendant

II. Relief for Charging Party

1. Defendant will pay a total of \$45,000 ("Settlement Sum"), including attorneys fees and costs, and compensatory damages to Jessica Polk. Within 10 days after execution of the Decree, Defendant will mail a check to Polk, in the amount of the Settlement Sum, in care of her attorney, David Terry, Johnson, Fellows, Blake & Terry, 1034 Brentwood Blvd., Suite 1380, St. Louis, Missouri 63117.

III. Posting and Policies

- 1. Defendant shall post and cause to remain posted copies of the "Notice to Employees", including its Policy Against Harassment, attached hereto as Exhibit A, in locations publicly visible to all employees in all stores operated by Defendant within District 0811, comprising 26 stores in the St. Louis area, for a period of two (2) years, starting from the date of entry of this Decree. Defendant maintains that it has had posted the posting required by this paragraph.
- 2. Defendant shall post and cause to remain posted the posters required to be displayed in the workplace by EEOC regulation 29 C.F.R. §1601.30 in all stores operated by Defendant within the state of Missouri. Defendant maintains that it currently posts the posters required to be displayed in the workplace by EEOC regulation 29 C.F.R. §1601.30 in all stores operated by Defendant within the state of Missouri.

3. Defendant shall, within six (6) months from the date of entry of this Decree, provide sexual harassment training to all management and non-management employees at all stores in District 0811, comprising 26 stores in the St. Louis area.

IV. Reporting, Record-keeping, and Access

- 1. During the effective period of this Decree, Defendant shall, within fifteen (15) days of such complaint, provide written notification to the EEOC's Regional Attorney in its St. Louis District Office of any internal complaint of sex harassment, made by any employee at any of the stores in District 0811, comprising 26 stores in the St. Louis, area including the name(s) of the employee(s), a description of the investigation of the complaint(s), the finding of the investigation and a description of action taken, or resolution of the complaint(s).
- 2. Within forty-five (45) days of the entry of this Decree, Defendant shall prepare and submit to the EEOC's Regional Attorney in its St. Louis District Office a letter affirming that the Notices have been posted and that the posters have been posted as required by Section III, above.
- 3. Within forty-five (45) days of the completion of the training required under Section III, subsection 3, Defendant shall prepare and submit to the EEOC's Regional Attorney in its St. Louis District Office a letter affirming completion of said training. The letter shall include the names of all employees who attended the training.

V. Term and Effect of Decree

1. By entering into this Decree the parties do not intend to resolve any charges of discrimination currently pending before the Commission other than the charge or charges that created the procedural foundation for the complaint in this case.

- 2. This Decree shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.

 Defendant shall affirmatively notify any purchasers of the obligations of this Consent Decree

 prior to any sale which may take place.
- 3. This Decree shall be for a period of two (2) years and can only be extended for good cause shown. During the Decree's term the Court shall retain jurisdiction of this cause for purposes of compliance.
 - 4. Each party shall bear that party's own costs and attorneys fees.

Employees under 20 years of age may be paid \$4.25 per hour during their first 90 consecutive calendar days of employment with an employee.

Certain full-time students, aludent learners, apprentices, and workers with disabilities may be paid less than the minimum wage under special certificates issued by the Department of Labor.

The Carlli-Employers of Tipped employees must pay a cash wage of at least \$2.73 per hour it they claim a tip credit against their minimum wage obligation. If an amployee's lips combined with the employee's cash wage of at least \$2.73 per hour do not equal the minimum hourly wage, the employer must make up the difference. Certain other conditions must also be may.

Overtime Pay

At least 14, limes your regular rate of pay for all hours worked over 40 in a workweek.

Child I show

An employee must be at least 16 years old to work in most mon-term jobs and at least 18 to work in mon-term jobs decisied hazardous by the Secretary of Labot. Youths 14 and 15 years old may work outside school fours in various non-manulacturing, non-mining, non-hazardous jobs under the following conditions:

No more than-3 hours on a school day or 18 hours in a school week.

-5 hours on a mon-school day or 45 hours in a non-school week.

Also, work may not begin belone 7 a.m., or and elter 7 p.m., except from June 1 Wrough Lebor Day, when evening hours are extended to 9 p.m. Different rules apply in agricultural employment.

Enforcement

The Department of Labor may recover back wages either administratively or through court action, for the employees that have been underpaid in violation of the law, Violations may result in civil or extended action.

Fines of up to \$10,000 per violation may be assessed against employers who violate the child labor provisions of the law and up to \$1,000 per violation against employers who willfully or repeatedly violate the minimum wage of overtime pay provisions. The Employee Polygraph Protection Act prohibits must private employers from using its detector tests allfler for pre-employment screening or during the course of employment.

Prohibitions

Employers are generally prohibited from requiring or requesting any employee of job applicant to take a lie detector test, and from discharging, disciplining, or discriminating against an employee or prospective employee for refusing to take a test or for exercising other tions under the Act.

Exemptions*

Faderal, State and local governments are not affected by the law. Also, the law does not apply to least given by the Federal Government to certain private Individuals angaged in national security-related activities. The Act pompts polygraph (a find of he detector) tests to be administrated in the private sector, subject to restrictions, to certain prospective employees of security sorvice time (amongo car, alam, and grand), and of phanty-security and architectures, distributors and dispensers, the Act also pompts polygraph leating, subject to restrictions, of certain amployees of private limits who are presentedly suspected of involvement in a workplace incident (theft, embezziement, etc.) that resulted in

economic lass to the employer.

Examinee Rights

Where polygraph leads are permitted, they are subject to numerous shirt standards concerning the conduct and length of the last. Examinous have a number of specific rights, including the right to a written notice before testing, the right to refuse or discontinue a test, and the right not to have test results discossed to unsufficience persons.

Enforcement

The Secretary of Labor may bring court actions to restrain violations and observed civil penalties up to \$10,000 against violators. Employees or job applicants may also bring their own court sollors.

Additional information may be obtained, and complaints of violations may be filed, at local offices of the Wago and Hour Division, which are listed in the telephone directory under U.S. Government, Department of Labor, Employment Standards Administration.

our Rights Under the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993

The Family and Medical Leave Act requires covered employers to provide up to 12 weeks of unpaid. lab-protected leave to "eligible" employees for certain family and medical reasons. Employees are aligible if they have worked for a covered employer for at least months, and for 1,250 hours over the previous 12: itis, and if there are at least 50 employees within

Apparent for Taking Leave: Unpaid laave must be granted for any of the tollowing reasoner,

To care for the employee's child after birth, or placement for adoption or toster care;

Job Salety and Health Protection

The Occupational Salety and Health Act of 1970 provides Job saloly and health protection for workers by promoting sale and healthful working conditions throughout the Nation. Provisions of the act include the following:

Employers

All employers must furnish to employees employment and a place of employment free from recognized hazzirds that are causing or are likely to course death or serious harm to employees. Employers must comply with cocupational salely and health standards issued under the Act.

Employees

Employees must comply with all occupational safety and health standards, rules, regulations and orders issued under the Act that apply to their own actions and conduct on the job. The Occupational Salety and Health Administration (OSHA) of the U.S. Department of Labor has the primary responsibility for administrance the Act, OSHA because compational safety and health standards, and its Compliance Salaby and Habith Officers conduct lob site inspections to help ensure sompliance with the Act.

Inspection

The Act motives that a representative of the employer and a representative authorized by the employees be given an opportunity to accompany the OSHA inspector for the purpose of alding the inepositon,

Where there is no authorized employee representative, the QSHA Compliance Officer must consult with a reasonable number of employees concerning salely and health conditions in the workplace.

Complaint

Employees or their representatives have the right to file a complaint with the nearest OSHA office requesting an inspection il they believe unsale or unhostitului conditions exis In their workplace, OSHA will withhold, on request, marries of employees compleming.

The Act provides that employees may not be discharged or discriminated against in any way for filing salety and health complaints or for otherwise exercising their pights under the Act. Employees who believe they have been discriminated against may file a complaint with their nearest OSHA office willing 30 days of the alleged discriminatory action.

The OSHA distion must be prominently displayed at or nea the place of alleged violation for three days, or until it is connected, whichever is later, to warm employees of congen that may adds there.

Proposed Penalty

The Act provides for mandalory dvil paralities against employers of up to \$7,000 for each serious violation and for optional panelties of up to \$7,000 for each non-serious violation. Ponelilles of up to \$7,000 per day may be proposed for fallure to correct violations within the proposed time period and for each day the violation continues beyond the prescribed abalament date. Also, any amployet: who willfully or repealedly violetes the Art may be assessed penalties of up to \$70,000 for each such violation. A minimum penalty of \$5,000 may be imposed for each willful violation. A violation of positing requirements can bring a penalty of up to \$7,000. There are also provisions for critical pensities. Any willful vicialion resulting in the death of any employee, upon convision, is punishable by a time of up to \$250,000 (of \$500,000 if the himployer is a corporation), or by Imprisorment for up to six months, or both. Peatons for Taking Loave: hald leave must be granted for any of the following manages:

 To care for the amployae's child alter birth, or placement for adoption or fester care;

To care for the employee's apoyse, son or daughter, or parent, who has a serious health condition; or

For a serious health condition that makes the employee unable to parliam the employee's job. At the employee's or employer's option, certain kinds of paid leave may be substituted for impeld leave.

Advance Notice & Medical Certification:
The employee may be required to provide advance leave notice and medical certification. Taking of leave may be denied if requirements are not met.

The employee ordinarily must provide 30 days advance notice when the leave is "foreseable."

An ethiployer may require medical certification to authorit a request for leave because of a serious health the employer's expense) and a fitness for duty report to telum to work.

Job Benefits & Protections

 For the duration of FMLA leave, the employer must maintain the amployer's health coverage under any "group health pien."

 Upon return from FMLA leave, most employees must be restored to their original or equivalent positions with equivalent or equal pay, benefile, and other employment terms.

e use of FMLA leave cannot result in the loss of employment benefit that accruse prior to the start of an employee's leave.

Uniewful Acts By Employana

FMLA makes it unlewful for any employer to:

- Inlarters with, restrain, or deny the exercise of any right provided under FMIA.

 Discharge or discriminate against any person for opposing any practice made unlawful by FMLA or for involvement in any proceeding under or relating to FMLA.

Enforcement

The U.S. Department of Labor is authorized to the tight and reasive completes of violations.

 An eligible employee may bring a civil action against an employer for visitations.

FMIA does not affect any Federal or State law prohibiting discrimination, or appointed any State or local law or collective bargaining agreement which provides greater lamity or medical leave rights.

OSHA's Voluntary Protection Programs recognize outstanding efforts of this nature, OSHA has published Salety and Health Program.

Management Guidelines to assist employers in establishing in personal or control employee exposure to prevent or control employee exposure to workplace trazents. There are many public and private organizations that can provide information and assistance in this effort, if requested, Also, your local OSHA office can provide considerable help and advise on solving salety and health problems or can refer you to other sources for help such as training.

Consultation

Free assistance in identifying and connecting trazents and in improving safety and treath management is available to employees, without clients or penalty, through OSHA supported programs in each State. These programs are usually administered by the State Labor or Health department a false university.

Posting instructions

Employers in States operating OSHA approved State Plans should obtain and post the State's equivalent poster.

Under provisions of Title 29, Code of Federal Regulation, Part 1903.2 (a)(1), employers must post this notice (or (acsimile) in a conspicuous place whose notices to employees are customarily posted.
