Defendants move this Court to dismiss the above styled cause of action and pending Motion of Preliminary Injunction in connection therewith on the grounds that the plaintiffs have no legal or equitable standing to maintain this suit as shown by the following:

- 1. On January 14, 1964, the Board of Commissioners of State Institutions of the State of Florida, having jurisdiction and control over the Division of Child Training Schools, which embraces all of the Florida Schools for Boys and Florida Schools for Girls in this state, entered an Order releasing the above named plaintifs from the said Florida Schools for Boys and Girls. (See copy of the minutes of the Board attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "A")
- 2. On January 19, 1964, the forementioned plaintiffs were in fact, released from the said Florida School for Boys and Girls in accordance with the Order of the Board, as set forth in paragraph (1). (See letter of the Director attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "B")

- 3. The object and purpose to be served by a declaratory judgement under Title 28 U.S.C.S., Section 2201, no longer exists, inasmuch as there is no actual or justiciable controversy between the parties; the legal questions raised by the Complaint are abstract and moot; and this Court would be, in effect, rendering an advisory opinion having no effect upon the substantial rights or interest of the plaintiffs herein. (See 19 Federal Practice Digest, Sections 61-66, pages 469-83; see also Wood v. Vaughn, U.S. Dist. Ct., Va. 1962, 209 F.S. 106)
 - 4. The object and purpose to be served by any injunctive relief no longer exists, inasmuch as the circumstances have so changed that no remedy can be granted effecting the substantial rights of the plaintiffs. (See Reiter v. Universal Marion Corp., 273 Fed. 2d 820; U.S. Court of Appeals, Dist. of Col., 1959).

WHEREFORE, in light of the foregoing, it is respectfully requested that this Court enter an Order to dismiss.


