The recent election of Jon Ossof and Raphael Warnock to the United States Senate, and certified by the Gerogia Secretary of State on January 19, 2021, is unconstitutional and void.

The State of Gerogia cannot impose upon the Plaintiff the State's constitutional duty to select the State's United States Senators. The Plaintiff has no constitutional authority to choose the State of Gerogia's United States Senators. The State of Georgia has asked the Plaintiff to violate the Constitution and to do something that he has no authority to do.

Statement of facts:

Article 1, section 3 states that the Senate is "chosen by the legislature thereof," not by a popular election.

Article 5 states that, "no State, without its consent, shall be deprived of its equal suffrage in the Senate."

"State" in Article 5 means "state legislature," the state government or the State in its political capacity. It does not mean a geographic location.

The State of Gerogia did not ratify the Seventeenth Amendment and therefore it did not consent to be deprived of its equal suffrage in the Senate. If the State of Georgia loses all of its suffrage then it has certainly lost its equal suffrage.

According to the Constitution, the people are reprsented in the House of Representatives.

According to the Constitution, the States, meaning the state legislatures, the state governments, are represented in the Senate. But, if the people elect the Senate, then the people are represented in the Senate and the State has lost all of its suffrage in the Senate. That cannot happen without the State's consent.

This dispute will be decided by the meaning of the word "State" in Article 5 of the Constitution.

IV. Relief
