PROPOSED VERIFIED INTERVENING COMPLAINT FOR EMERGENCYDECLARATORY AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

MEMORANDUM OF LAW IN SUPPORT

- 1. Defendants effectively are asserting that the established party status afforded to the Illinois Green Party ("Green Party," "Greens") within the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago ("MWRDGC") for 2022 elections does not extend in "umbrella" fashion to all governmental entities that lie within the boundaries of the District. The Greens beg to differ.
- 2. Specifically, Karen Yarbrough (in her official capacity as Cook County Clerk) has, for purposes of the June 28, 2022 primary, determined that the Greens may run township committeeperson candidates only in those townships where individuals were elected directly in 2018. On this basis, she has deemed that only six of the thirty townships that lie within the MWRDGC are established as to the Green Party; the other twenty-four, from which no Green candidates ran in 2018, are in her view not established and, hence, precluded from consideration for purposes of the 2022 general election.

- 3. Greens in the other twenty-four townships are thereby frustrated to the point of apparent preclusion and exclusion in their attempts to run for committeepersons in 2022. As described in the proposed complaint, the Clerk's stance is thought by the prospective intervenors to infringe on the equal protection and due process rights that are to be afforded to potential Green Party candidates by the Fourteenth Amendment.
- 4. There is another theory at law which is thought to render as moot the Clerk's groundless and unsubstantiated position on the Green Party's establishment of townships: the doctrine of equitable estoppel.
- 5. It should be noted that in Illinois, "estoppel against municipalities is disfavored." *Corbin v. Schroeder*, 2021 IL 127052, at ¶ 40. The *Corbin* court then went on to quote, favorably, from *Patrick Engineering*, *Inc. v. City of Naperville*, 2012 IL 113148, ¶ 40:
 - "(A) plaintiff seeking to invoke equitable estoppel against a municipality must plead specific facts that show (1) an affirmative act by either the municipality itself or an official with express authority to bind the municipality; and (2) reasonable reliance upon that act by the plaintiff that induces the plaintiff to detrimentally change its position."
- 6. In past years, the Clerk has published certain voting summaries from primary elections. Two are illustrative. In 2014, Republican committeeperson races from Stickney and Calumet Townships were reported as "no candidate". No votes not even write-ins were cast for these positions. Yet by publishing null results in the election summary, the Clerk implicitly (yet effectively) continued to recognize the two townships as established. Please see Exhibit A.
- 7. Similarly, in 2018, the Republican committeeperson contest in Calumet Township had no candidates and no votes. By dint of the summary, however, the Clerk continued to implicitly deem Calumet Township as established. Please see Exhibit B.

8. It is suggested that given the disparate treatments of recognizing "no candidate" townships as

remaining established for Republicans while asserting that the Green Party is summarily precluded

from running committeepersons due to "no candidate" status in the election immediately prior is

inherently contradictory and, once again, represents denials of due process and equal protection by the

Clerk.

9. In short, the Greens have relied on the Clerk's practice of maintaining some townships (in these two

instances, Republicans) in recognized status despite their "no candidate" committeeperson races.

Accordingly, the Clerk now, as a matter of equity, must be deemed estopped from refusing Green Party

petitions in townships that previously had no Green candidates.
