NOTICE OF SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

The defendants need to give this Court the following supplemental information about the Secretary's plans to implement HB 282 in light of statements made in declarations and by counsel at the preliminary injunction hearing.

First, as noted at the hearing, Brent Beal testified by declaration that the Secretary has always intended to hold a press conference about the new law and that the conference was planned for July 27, 2017. Unfortunately, that press conference did not take place as anticipated. Nonetheless, the Secretary's office is still considering additional ways to promote the law.

Second, as explained at the hearing, the Secretary of State's computer database is not searchable by the year that a voter is removed from the voter rolls, even though aggregate data about how many removals occur is available. A fuller

explanation of the database is included in the attached Second Declaration of Ed Packard.

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SECOND DECLARATION OF EDWARD PACKARD

- 1. My name is Edward Packard. I have been an employee of the Elections Division of the Alabama Secretary of State's Office for approximately 20 years.
- 2. The Secretary of State's office has provided to the plaintiffs in this lawsuit a list of names, addresses, and other voter information for approximately 60,000 felons who were removed from voter lists or denied registration. I prepared that list.
- 3. It is unclear how far back in time the list goes. I can perform an electronic search on the Secretary of State's voter records by date of registration but not the date that someone is removed from the voter list. To determine which of the approximately 60,000 felons were removed from the list in the last two years, I would need to click on each felon's individual voter file in our system, look at the information in that file to find the date when action was last taken on that file, and then use that information to manually cull the list of 60,000 down to those who were removed over the last two years. If I reviewed 1 voter file every minute, 60 files an hour, it would take approximately 1,000 hours to cull the list to only those felons who have been removed over the last two years.

4. I understand that the plaintiffs claim that I could cull the list through the same process that

I use to prepare NVRA reports about the aggregate number of removals over a two-year period.

But our computer system does not work that way. Attached as an exhibit to this declaration are

screenshots that show how the NVRA reports are prepared. The first page is the configuration

page for the NVRA reports, where I can choose to present the information by county, by date

range, etc. The second page is the results page, which provides aggregate information about

removals. Because this aggregate information is not linked to any specific voter, I cannot use this


system to prepare a list of names and addresses of voters who have been removed from the voter

list over the last two years.
