Sir:

First I am ignorant of U.S. Election law and would ask that this letter be filed by the clerk and forwarded to the Chief Magistrate for review.

Second I am asking that the recent election for Sheriff, State Attorney and all other elected positions in Alachua County be set aside by a temporary injunction, and re set for a later election date pending ruling of the Court.

Third I am a registered Democrat, I was precluded from my U.S. and Florida Constitutional rights to vote, across party lines because of the system. I was only allowed to vote for someone in my party regardless of the competency or my right to vote for the candidate of my choice to hold elected office.

Fourth In the State Attorneys race not one soul in the Eighth Judicial Circuit voted for the person going into the office. A Judge in Tallahassee erroneously declared one candidate not eligible after qualifications, leaving only one person in the race. The thin line was that the non eligible candidate was not eligible because she had a 15 day sanction by the Florida Bar, had she qualified a few days later she would have been qualified to seek the office.

I do believe the election should have been set for a later date so that any Attorney might qualify for the office. The people of the Eighth Judicial Circuit should decide who will be the next State Attorney. I could find no case law that supports a Judge deciding who is to be the State Attorney for the Eighth Circuit.

With regards to the Sheriffs race in Alachua County not one Republican was allowed the Constitutional right to vote. Less than 30% of registered voters in Alachua County, and not one Republican decided the election outcome. This is not Democracy! I wonder what the 70% that were not allowed to vote feel. Is their vote or political wish without merit.

If I was registered in the communist party I would not be allowed to vote at all. And would be denied my Constitutional guaranteed rights as a U.S. Citizen to vote, be it for a Democrat, Republican or an Independent.

Fourth As I am without legal knowledge I would ask the court to entertain this as a Friend of the Court lawsuit. I am without legal counsel, I would ask that a competent Attorney be assigned to properly plead this before the sitting U.S. Magistrate.

I am also without the immense financial resources to properly bring this before the Court, would ask that the cost of filings and pleadings be waived in the pursuit of Justice and the right to vote for any

candidate regardless of party affiliation for the U.S., Florida State, County, City, political races by citizens of the United States.
