<u>COMPLAINT</u> (Declaratory Judgment)

Plaintiffs John Bowman, Karen Cloyd, Glenn Koenen, Susan Meredith, Tommie Pierson, Jr., Dana Sandweiss and Brian Wingbermuehle (collectively, "Plaintiffs"), by and through their undersigned attorneys, for their complaint for declaratory judgment, state as follows:

PARTIES

- 1. Plaintiff John Bowman is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri residing and registered to vote in St. Louis County Council District 1.
- 2. Plaintiff Karen Cloyd is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri residing and registered to vote in St. Louis County Council District 7.
- 3. Plaintiff Glenn Koenen is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri residing and registered to vote in St. Louis County Council District 6.
- 4. Plaintiff Susan Meredith is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri residing and registered to vote in St. Louis County Council District 2.
- 5. Plaintiff Tommie Pierson, Jr. is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri residing and registered to vote in St. Louis County Council District 4.
- 6. Plaintiff Dana Sandweiss is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri residing and registered to vote in St. Louis County Council District 5.
- 7. Plaintiff Brian Wingbermeuhle is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri residing and registered to vote in St. Louis County Council District 3.
- 8. Defendant Robert L. Chambers is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri, residing in St. Louis County, and is a member, and the Chair, of the St. Louis County Board of Election Commissioners (the "Board").

- 9. Defendant Patricia Yaeger is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri, residing in St. Louis County, and is a member, and the current Secretary, of the Board.
- 10. Defendant Marsha E. Haeffner is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri, residing in St. Louis County, and is a member of the Board.
- 11. Defendant Florence Hill is an individual citizen of the State of Missouri, residing in St. Louis County, and is a member of the Board.
- 12. Defendants comprise all members of the Board. This action is brought against Defendants in their official capacities as members of the Board and the officials in charge of elections in St. Louis County, in particular with respect to the Council Districts challenged in this action. At all times relevant to this Complaint, the actions or putative actions of Defendants are, were or would be actions taken under color of the Constitution, statutes, regulations, customs, usages and other applicable laws of the State of Missouri.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 13. Plaintiffs bring this action as citizens and registered voters to redress violations of their rights to equal protection of the laws conferred and guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, 42 U.S.C. §§ 1983 and 1988, and Art. I, Sec. 2 of the Missouri Constitution.
- 14. This Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 and 1343(a)(3), 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and federal principles of pendent jurisdiction.
- 15. An actual controversy exists between Plaintiffs and Defendants so that this Court may declare the rights and other legal relations of the parties under 28 U.S.C. § 2201, and may grant other or further relief to Plaintiffs under 28 U.S.C. § 2202.

16. The transactions and occurrences giving rise to Plaintiffs' claims occurred in the Eastern District of Missouri. All Plaintiffs live and vote in St. Louis County, which lies within the Eastern District of Missouri. Venue therefore is proper under 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b).

FACTS

- 17. The St. Louis County Charter (the "Charter") vests all legislative power of the County in a County Council, comprised of seven (7) members elected from seven (7) Council Districts.
- 18. The Charter requires that the Council Districts be reapportioned and redrawn every tenth year ending in one (1), *i.e.*, in the year following each decennial census mandated by the Constitution of the United States. Charter, § 2.035.
- 19. To that end, the Charter requires that the County Executive appoint a bipartisan commission from nominees submitted by the Central Committees of the two major political parties, with one Democrat and one Republican commission member from each existing Council District.
- 20. The St. Louis County Council Bipartisan Reapportionment Commission (the "Commission") is charged with the duty to "reapportion the council districts by dividing the population of the county by the number of council districts established by this charter so that the population of each district shall, as near as possible, equal that figure and so that each district shall be composed of contiguous territory as compact as may be." Charter, § 2.035.
- 21. The Census Bureau reported the population of the United States according to the 2020 Census on April 26, 2021.
- 22. According to the 2020 Census, the populations of the seven current Council Districts have changed substantially and now are unequal.

- 23. On May 28, 2021, the St. Louis County Executive made his initial appointments of members to the Commission as mandated by the Charter.
- 24. The Charter required the Commission to file a reapportionment plan and map not later than six months following the date that the 2020 Census results were reported, or the date that the County Executive appointed the Commission members, whichever is later.
- 25. Accordingly, the deadline for filing the Commission's report and map was no later than November 28, 2021.
- 26. As of the filing of this Complaint, which occurred subsequent to November 28, 2021, the Commission has failed to adopt or file a plan or map to reapportion and redraw the Council Districts based on the 2020 Census.
- 27. The Charter does not provide a means for the Commission's deadline to be extended. Further, the Charter does not provide any other mechanism by which the Districts may be reapportioned and redrawn.
- 28. Neither the Charter, nor any other provision of Missouri law, provides any procedural or substantive recourse for the Commission's failure to fulfill its charge to reapportion the Council Districts and redraw the district boundaries such that the Council Districts meet the requirements that they be of equal population as near as possible, and be composed of contiguous territory as compact as may be.
- 29. The Charter provides that Council members are to be elected from the odd-numbered Council Districts (1, 3, 5 and 7) in 2022. *See* Charter, § 2.040.
- 30. Pursuant to applicable law, candidates for election to such Council seats may begin filing with the Board on February 22, 2022, with the last day of filing occurring on March 29, 2022.

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COUNT I – REQUEST FOR DECLARATORY AND OTHER RELIEF

31. Plaintiffs incorporate the allegations of all preceding paragraphs as if fully set forth in this Count I.

- 32. The Commission's failure to adopt and file a plan and map for the reapportionment and redrawing of the Council Districts leaves existing Council Districts that are now unequal in population following the 2020 Census.
- 33. Accordingly, the vote of each qualified resident of the County is not given equal weight to those residing in other Council Districts, and the current apportionment and existing Council Districts violate the principle of "one person, one vote."
- 34. If the 2022 Council elections are held using the existing Council Districts, which are based on the 2010 Census, Plaintiffs' rights to equal protection of the laws under the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, and to equal rights and opportunity under the law pursuant to Article I, Section 2 of the Missouri Constitution, will be violated.
- 35. The Constitutions of the United States and of the State of Missouri, as well as other applicable law, require that St. Louis County be divided into seven (7) Council Districts meeting the requirements that they be of equal population as near as possible, and be composed of contiguous territory as compact as may be; and it is imperative that this occur before February 22, 2022.
- 36. Potential candidates for election to the Council's odd-numbered districts are unable to decide whether, or in what District, to run due to the uncertainty caused by the Commission's failure to fulfill its charge under the Charter. Therefore, reapportionment of the Council Districts, in compliance with the applicable state and federal constitutional provisions and other law, is required as soon as practicable. The Commission's failure has resulted in a civil rights emergency.

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WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court enter judgment in favor of

Plaintiffs and against Defendants, and grant the following relief:

A. Declare that the current Council Districts are unequal in population such that they

violate the requirements of the Constitution of the United States and the Missouri

Constitution, and Plaintiffs' rights arising therefrom;

B. Reapportion and redraw the Council Districts such that the County is divided into seven

(7) districts of equal population as near as possible, comprised of contiguous territory

as compact as may be, as soon as practicable and before candidacy filing opens on

February 22, 2022;

C. Enter any and all such injunctive or other relief that the Court determines is necessary

or appropriate;

D. Award to Plaintiffs, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1988(b), all of their costs and attorney's

fees incurred in this action; and

E. Grant such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.

Authority For Civil Cover Sheet

The JS 44 civil cover sheet and the information contained herein neither replaces nor supplements the filings and service of pleading or other papers as required by law, except as provided by local rules of court. This form, approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States in September 1974, is required for the use of the Clerk of Court for the purpose of initiating the civil docket sheet. Consequently, a civil cover sheet is submitted to the Clerk of Court for each civil complaint filed. The attorney filing a case should complete the form as follows:
