United States*, 791 F.3d 354, 358 (2nd Cir. 2015); *see. e.g.*, So-Ordered Stipulation of Voluntary Dismissal With Prejudice, *Dannhauser v. TSG Reporting, Inc.*, No. 16 Civ. 747 (S.D.N.Y. Dec. 20, 2017), ECF No. 93. Subject to the terms of this Order, the Court dismisses the remaining injunctive claims in the consolidated cases in the above-captioned action with prejudice pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(a)(2).
