# Title

MOTION to Dismiss by President and Fellows of Harvard College. (Ellsworth, Felicia) (Entered: 07/22/2024)

# Text

Defendant President and Fellows of Harvard College ("Harvard") hereby moves to dismiss this action in its entirety pursuant to  $Federal\ Rules\ of\ Civil\ Procedure\ 12(b)(1)\ and\ 12(b)(6)$ . The grounds for this motion, which are explained in detail in the accompanying Memorandum of Law, include the following: 1. The Court should dismiss this action under Rule 12(b)(1) because Plaintiffs fail to establish organizational standing for the Louis D. Brandeis Center ("Brandeis Center") or Jewish Americans for Fairness in Education ("JAFE").

- 2. The Court should dismiss Plaintiffs' claims under Rule 12(b)(1) because Plaintiffs fail to establish associational standing for the Brandeis Center or JAFE. Plaintiffs' claims require the individualized participation of their members, and their members lack standing to seek prospective injunctive relief, the only form of relief sought here, as they do not plead an ongoing or certainly impending injury traceable to Harvard.
- 3. The Court should dismiss Plaintiffs' Title VI claims under Rule 12(b)(6) because Plaintiffs do not plausibly allege that Harvard directly discriminated against their members, acted with deliberate indifference to a hostile environment, or retailed in any way against Plaintiffs' members.
- 4. In support of this Motion, Harvard submits the accompanying Memorandum of Law and the Declarations of Meredith Weenick and Felicia Ellsworth.

WHEREFORE, Harvard respectfully requests that the Court dismiss this action in its entirety.

REQUEST FOR ORAL ARGUMENT

Pursuant to Local Rule 7.1(d), Defendant respectfully requests oral argument of this Motion.
