ORDER

Upon consideration of the court's memorandum opinion filed in the above-captioned matter on this date, it is hereby ORDERED that:

- 1. Marion Barry, in his official capacity as Mayor of the District of Columbia, James Palmer, in his official capacity as Director of the Department of Corrections, and George Holland, in his official capacity as Assistant Director for Detention Services, are in civil contempt for failing to comply with this court's orders of October 8 and December 17, 1982
- 2. In consequence thereof, the above-named defendants are fined \$50,000, to be paid in 180 days from the issuance of this order, and \$1,000 for each day following the issuance of this order that the defendants are not in compliance with the court's orders.
- 3. If, for the duration of the 180-day period, the defendants achieve and maintain compliance with the court's orders, and produce adequate documentation to verify their

compliance, they will be purged of the contempt finding and will not have to pay the \$50,000 fine imposed herein.

- 4. Defendants shall pay plaintiffs' counsel the costs connected with the prosecution of this contempt proceeding, including reasonable attorney's fees, in an amount to be fixed by the court. Counsel for plaintiffs shall submit an affidavit to the court in support of such an award.
- 5. The defendants shall continue to file monthly compliance reports with the court. Copies of these reports shall be sent to counsel for plaintiffs in the above-captioned matter, as well as to counsel for plaintiffs in <u>Inmates v. Jackson</u>, C.A. No. 75-1668.
- 6. A joint evidentiary hearing will be held in the above-captioned matter and in <u>Inmates v. Jackson</u>, C.A. No. 75-1668, on Tuesday, November 1, 1983 at 10:00 a.m., regarding the status and/or effects of housing in the so-called "floor space".
