RENEWED MOTION FOR IMMEDIATE TRIAL DATE AND MOTION FOR WRITTEN ORDER DENYING DEFENDANTS' MOTION TO DISMISS ON LETHAL INJECTION CLAIMS

### **NOTICE**

Please take notice that this Motion has been docketed for consideration in the above referenced Court on Wednesday, October 13, 2004 at 9:00 a.m.

#### **MOTION**

Plaintiffs, by counsel, pursuant to CR 40 and CR 57, respectfully move this Court to assign the above-styled case a trial date as soon as possible. In support of this motion, Plaintiffs state as follows:

- This an action for declaratory and injunctive relief; as such the Rules of Civil Procedure contemplate advancement on the Court's docket. See CR 57.
- Plaintiff Bowling's petition for a writ of certiorari to the United States
   Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit was denied by the United States
   Supreme Court on October 4, 2004.
- 3. Bowling's execution could be set at any moment.
- 4. General counsel for the Governor, the Honorable John Roach, has notified Bowling's counsel that the attorney general's office will seek a warrant very soon and that counsel should consider expediting their request for clemency.
- 5. This Court has orally denied Defendants' motion to dismiss the lethal injection claims (Plaintiffs also request that this Court issue an immediate written order denying Defendants' motion to dismiss the lethal injection claims).

- 6. There are no impediments to going to trial immediately and the rules of civil procedure do not require waiting for further responsive pleadings before scheduling a trial date.
- 7. This lawsuit was filed on August 9, 2004, two months ago. From the onset of this litigation, Plaintiffs have attempted to expedite review of the case.

  They were ready to go to trial almost immediately and so notified Defendants and this Court.

Defendants have had two months to prepare for a trial that involves few witnesses including witnesses that Defendants know well. Plaintiffs have been diligent in proceeding with each aspect of this case. Defendants, however, continuously attempt to delay a trial on the merits. Defendants have the authority to await the conclusion of this litigation prior to scheduling Bowling's execution, but choose not to do so. In light of this Court's ruling denying Defendants' motion to dismiss, and information that Bowling's execution will be scheduled almost immediately by Defendants despite their attempts to prevent a trial on this issue, Plaintiffs respectfully request that this Court set the matter for trial as soon as possible.
