CONSENT ORDER OF DISMISSAL

All of the parties except the Attorney General of the State of Alabama (hereinafter "all of the parties") in the above captioned cases have agreed upon the entry of the following order:

1. Existing conditions in the Alabama Prison System, with certain changes to be effected at the West Jefferson Correctional Facility, to the satisfaction of the Prison Implementation Committee ("Committee"), are in sufficient compliance with the requirements of the Constitution of the United States, particularly the Eighth and Fourteenth Amendments, to permit all of the parties to recommend dismissal of this action subject to the conditions contained in this order.

2. This Court as of December 3, 1984, relinquishes the exercise of jurisdiction in these cases.


3. The Committee will continue in existence until January 1, 1988, to conduct such monitoring activities as it deems appropriate in accordance with the fulfillment of its role in these cases.

4. The jurisdiction of this Court may be reactivated only upon petition by a majority of the Committee, and subsequent action of this Court will be upon the recommendation of the Committee.

5. On January 1, 1988, if these cases have not been reactivated under the foregoing procedures, these actions will be dismissed with prejudice by the Court.

6. All of the parties will bear their own costs and expenses.
