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The Moore Group and additional class members who have opted out of the proposed settlement (the "Opt-Out Objectors"), through counsel, respectfully submit this Statement and Objections to the Proposed Class Settlement ("Settlement").

The twenty-one Opt-Out Objectors appreciate the Court's willingness to hear the objections of the Moore Group during preliminary approval and are mindful of the Court's admonition against "repetitive submissions." Docket No. 158, at 1. The Opt-Out Objectors do not desire to burden the Court or subject themselves to sanctions.

With great respect to the Court, however, the Opt-Out Objectors believe they have a moral obligation to reaffirm their belief that, based on their individual and collective experiences, the Settlement is not adequate, fair or reasonable and is not in the best interest of the class. They therefore respectfully request that the Court accept and consider the objections, evidence and submissions presented by the Moore Group prior to preliminary approval of the Settlement (Docket Nos. 95, 119, 123, 129, 145, 152) in light of additional facts and arguments contained in the objections filed by class members who have objected to the Settlement but not opted out. The Opt-Out Objectors agree with and join in those objections.
