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20	PLAINTIFF ERNESTINA SALDANA-NEILY complains of
21	Defendants SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT; and DOES 1-20, and alleges
22	as follows:
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24	INTRODUCTION
25	1. PLAINTIFF is a physically disabled wheelchair user
26	who has been denied the basic right to freely and independently
27	use the public educational facilities at Soquel Cooperative
28	Nursery Preschool, located in the City of Soquel County of Santa

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Complaint for Injunctive Relief and Damages

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Cruz. PLAINTIFF ERNESTINA SALDANA-NEILY is a physically disabled women who requires the use of a wheelchair for mobility.

Plaintiff was denied her civil rights under both state and federal laws and regulations, due to the continuing inaccessible public facilities at Soquel Cooperative Nursery Preschool, which are inaccessible to disabled persons in multiple respects, including: inaccessible paths from the public right of way into the nursery school grounds, inaccessible paths of travel to the only (recently remodeled) front door entrance, inaccessible playground, inaccessible public restroom and lavatory facilities at the nursery school, and other inaccessible school programs and activities that are conducted as part of the parent/child involvement with the Adult Education Parent Program through the Soquel Cooperative Nursery Preschool Program.

2. Plaintiff challenges defendants' continued operation of public facilities that wrongfully deny access and public participation to Plaintiff as a parent of a child in the Soquel Cooperative Nursery School and as a participant in the Adult Education Parent Program at the Soquel Cooperative Nursery School, and to all other similarly disabled persons who require the use of wheelchairs to attend and participate in the programs, services and activities offered to parents and their children at the Soquel Cooperative Nursery Preschool. PLAINTIFF brings this action on her own behalf, and as private attorney general on behalf of the public.

JURISDICTION

3. The Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, 42

OAKLAND, CA 94612-3503 (510) 832-5001 U.S.C. sections 12101, et seq., ("ADA") confers jurisdiction on this Court over Plaintiff's claims, regardless of the amount in controversy.

- 4. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction of this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. sections 1343(3) and (4) for claims arising under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
- 5. Under the doctrine of supplemental jurisdiction, this Court has jurisdiction over plaintiff's claims arising under California state law.

11 VENUE

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6. Venue is proper in the Northern District of California, the judicial district in which the claim has arisen, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. section 1391(b).

PARTIES

- 7. Plaintiff is, and at all times relevant to this Complaint, was a physically "handicapped person," "physically disabled person," and "person with disabilities", as these terms are used under California law and under federal laws including but not limited to \$504 of the Rehabilitation Act and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. These terms, a "physically handicapped person", a "physically disabled person", and a "person with disabilities", will be used interchangeably throughout this Complaint. Plaintiff has mobility disabilities and requires the use of wheelchair for mobility.
- 8. Defendants SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT; AND DOES 1
 THROUGH 20, inclusive, are public entities subject to Title II

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of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, to \$504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, to the requirements of California State law requiring full and equal access to public facilities pursuant to Government Code \$4450 et seq. and elsewhere, and to all other legal requirements referred to in this complaint. Plaintiff does not know the relative responsibilities of each of the Defendants in the ownership and operation of the facilities herein complained of, and allege a joint venture and common enterprise by Defendants SANTA CRUZ CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND DOES 1-20 INCLUSIVE in the ownership and operation of each such facility, program or services offered.

9. Plaintiff does not know the true names and capacities of the Defendants sued herein as Does 1 through 20, or each of them, and therefore sues them under such fictitious On information and belief, defendants DOES 1-20 are state agencies and public entities who operate in the state of California. Plaintiff is informed and believes that all such defendants had some form of control or legal responsibility for the maintenance, ownership and/or operation of the facilities at Soquel Cooperative Nursery Preschool and the Adult Education Parent Program operated in conjunction with the Soquel Cooperative Nursery Preschool during periods of time relevant to this complaint. After appropriate discovery, Plaintiff will seek leave of the Court to amend this complaint to identify said DOE defendants when such defendants' true names and capacities have been ascertained.

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GOVERNMENT CLAIMS FILED (With regard to claims for damages under

California state law.)

10. Plaintiff ERNESTINA SALDANA-NEILY made timely claims for damages to the SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT on January 21, 2000, and an amended claim on June 7, 2000. These claims were rejected by operation of law on July 24, 2000.

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FACTUAL BASES FOR COMPLAINT

11. PLAINTIFF ERNESTINA SALDANA-NEILY: Plaintiff SALDANA-NEILY is and was at all times relevant to this action, a "physically disabled" person, and the mother of a preschool student enrolled at the Soquel Cooperative Nursery Preschool in conjunction with the Adult Education Parent Program, located on the campus of Soquel High School, instituted by the Santa Cruz School District (hereinafter, "Soquel Preschool"). In order for plaintiff's child to attend the preschool, plaintiff and her husband are required to attend weekly parenting classes, assist in the classroom and playground, and attend parenting functions. As a result of the inaccessible conditions at the preschool and Soquel High School, plaintiff has been unable to safely and independently access the school, and take meaningful part in parenting or school activities.

Commencing one year prior to the date of the filing of this lawsuit, and continuing to the date of this action, plaintiff has been denied her rights to full and equal access under federal and state law, including California Government Code \$\$4450 et seq., Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and sections 54 and 54.1 of the California Civil Code, as the result

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of the inaccessible facilities at the Soquel High School and
Soquel Preschool Nursery. The inaccessible conditions include;
an inaccessible and unsafe path of travel from the public right
of way to the entrance of the preschool; a front door entrance
that is not independently accessible; an inaccessible entrance to
the playground; inaccessible restroom and lavatory facilities;
and an inaccessible playground. As the result of the
inaccessible conditions at the school, plaintiff was forced to
sit outside for hours each week in inclement weather, by herself
with her infant daughter, for over six months before defendants
constructed a ramp to the front door of the school. Plaintiff is
still unable to access the playground entrance and once inside
the school is unable to use the restroom or lavatory facilities.

On February 15, 2000, plaintiff was forced to sit outside in the playground area, along with her infant daughter, in inclement weather in order to complete her weekly quota of "school" hours required for her child's enrollment in the preschool. After hours of sitting outside, plaintiff developed an urgent need to use restroom facilities. Since the only restrooms serving the school were located inside of the nursery school, which on February 15, 2000 was completely inaccessible to plaintiff (which restrooms are still inaccessible to wheelchair users), plaintiff was forced to leave the school premises in search of an accessible restroom. Plaintiff was unable to reach an accessible restroom in time and had a urinary accident shortly after leaving the school premises. Plaintiff, soiled and frustrated with her inability to participate in the school's parenting program, returned home in her soiled condition and

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missed her weekly parenting class. During the months between September and March prior to the installation of the ramp to the front door, plaintiff was forced to sit outside in the playground listening through an open door while the mother's and the teacher conducted their parenting classes inside the inaccessible preschool.

In addition to the architectural barriers, plaintiff has also been routinely excluded from participating in the parenting program with non-disabled students and parents school due to the inaccessible locations chosen by defendants for field trips and social gatherings. On or about the week of January 10th, 2000, defendants scheduled a "Mom's Night Out" for the mother's in plaintiff's parenting class. Attendance at this special event function was required for plaintiff's parenting group. This special event was scheduled to take place on the second floor banquet room of a local restaurant that plaintiff knew was not wheelchair accessible. Plaintiff informed the leader of this group that the restaurant was not wheelchair accessible, asking the leader how she could attend the special event in the inaccessible restaurant. The leader of the parenting group informed plaintiff that she would be "excused" from attending the special event, instead of relocating the event to an accessible restaurant. Defendants scheduled the "Mom's Night Out" special event in an inaccessible location without regard to plaintiff's inability to participate, and then exclude plaintiff from the event rather than relocate the event to an accessible location.

In addition to the above-cited incidents, plaintiff has

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on numerous occasions within the last year of the filing of this
complaint, been excluded from attending student and/or parenting
functions due to the inaccessibility of the subject premises,
and/or the inaccessible locations chosen by defendants for
student/parent field trips and/or school functions.
12. As a result of the actions and failure to act of
Defendants and each of them and as a result of the
inaccessibility of the preschool facilities, and of the programs

Defendants and each of them and as a result of the inaccessibility of the preschool facilities, and of the programs, services and activities, as above described, plaintiff ERNESTINA SALDANA-NEILY suffered denial of her Civil Rights, physical injuries, psychological and emotional distress, physical and emotional pain and suffering, embarrassment and humiliation, and denial of her rights to full and equal access to public facilities, all to her statutory and general damages. PLAINTIFF was embarrassed, humiliated, and suffered all detriment alleged herein on the basis that she was physically disabled and unable to enter and use Defendants' public facilities and/or programs, services and activities on a full and equal basis with non-disabled parents.

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FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION: DISCRIMINATION IN VIOLATION OF TITLE II OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990

13. PLAINTIFF repleads and incorporates by reference, as if fully set forth hereafter, the allegations contained in Paragraphs 1 through 12 of this complaint and incorporates them herein as if separately repled.

14. Effective January 26, 1992, PLAINTIFF was entitled to the protections of the "Public Services" provision of Title II

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of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Title II, Subpart A prohibits discrimination by any "public entity", including any state or local government, as defined by 42 USC \$12131, section 201 of the ADA. PLAINTIFF was at all times relevant herein a qualified individual with a disability as therein defined.

- 15. Pursuant to 42 USC §12132, Section 202 of Title II, no qualified individual with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs or activities of a public entity, or be subjected to discrimination by any such entity.
- their responsibilities under Title II to provide their services, programs and activities in a full and equal manner to disabled students as described hereinabove, including: failing to insure that the facilities described herein are accessible to disabled persons; failing to locate their programs, services and activities in facilities that are accessible to disabled persons; and failing to remove known architectural barriers at the subject facilities to make their public facilities accessible to disabled persons. As a proximate result of Defendants' action and omissions, Defendants have discriminated against PLAINTIFF, in violation of Title II of the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, and of the regulations adopted to implement the ADA.
- 17. As a result of such discrimination, in violation of \$202 of the ADA, PLAINTIFF are entitled to the remedies, procedures and rights set forth in Section 505 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 USC \$794a). PLAINTIFF also seeks

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injunctive relief to require Defendants to remove the barriers to
access complained of, to provide proper accommodations providing
reasonable access for Plaintiff to Defendants' programs, services
and activities, and to provide all remedies, and statutory
attorneys' fees, litigation expenses and costs, including those
remedies specified by section 203 and 505 of the Americans With
Disabilities Act of 1990 and by section 1021.5 California Code of
Civil Procedure, according to proof.

18. Injunctive Relief - To the date of filing this complaint, the specified public facilities and programs continue to be inaccessible for independent entry and use by physically disabled persons such as PLAINTIFF. PLAINTIFF requests that an injunction be ordered requiring that Defendants take prompt action to modify the aforementioned public facilities to render them accessible to and usable PLAINTIFF and other similarly situated physically disabled persons.

Wherefore, PLAINTIFF prays the court grant relief as requested hereinbelow.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION: VIOLATION OF §504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

- 19. PLAINTIFF repleads and incorporates by reference, as if fully set forth hereafter, the allegations contained in Paragraphs 1 through 18 of this complaint and incorporates them herein as if separately repled.
- 20. Defendants SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT; AND DOES 1 THROUGH 20, INCLUSIVE are governmental agencies existing under the laws of the State of California with responsibility for,

inter alia, operating the public facilities at the Soquel Cooperative Nursery Preschool, located on the campus of Soquel High School. PLAINTIFF is informed and believes and therefore alleges that SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT; AND DOES 1 THROUGH 20, INCLUSIVE are recipients of Federal financial assistance and that part of that financial assistance is used to fund the operations of the specific buildings and facilities described herein, and the activities which take place therein.

21. By its actions or inactions in denying disabled accessible facilities at the facilities and buildings specified, and in failing to provide access to other campus buildings and facilities, the SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT; AND DOES 1 THROUGH 20, INCLUSIVE have violated PLAINTIFF's rights under \$504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 USC \$794, and the regulations promulgated thereunder.

22. By their actions or inactions in denying to Plaintiff ERNESTINA SALDANA-NEILY, a disabled parent, her right to have equal access to the same programs, activities and environment as non-disabled parents, and by otherwise discriminating against PLAINTIFF solely by reason of her physical disabilities, Defendants and each of them have violated Plaintiff's rights under \$504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the regulations promulgated thereunder. PLAINTIFF seeks damages for denial of their Civil Rights, interference with her participation in the Adult Education Parenting Program of the Santa Cruz School District, for physical, mental and emotional injury, all to her damages according to proof. Further,

Defendants to correct the access deficiencies complained of
herein so that PLAINTIFF will not continue to be discriminated
against and injured on a frequent and recurrent basis as she is
forced to use unsafe public facilities and foreclosed from fully
participating in defendants' parenting program on the same basis
as non-disabled parents, and seeks recovery of statutory attorney
fees, litigation expenses and costs.

23. PLAINTIFF has no adequate remedy at law, and unless the relief requested herein is granted, PLAINTIFF will suffer irreparable injury by the continual deprivation of full and equal access to the specified public facilities at the Soquel Preschool Nursery and other public facilities operated by Defendants.

Wherefore, PLAINTIFF prays the court grant relief as requested, hereinbelow.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION: VIOLATION OF CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE \$4450 et seq.

24. PLAINTIFF repleads and incorporates by reference, as if fully set forth hereafter, the factual allegations contained in Paragraphs 1 through 23 of this complaint and

incorporates them herein as if separately repled.

25. PLAINTIFF is informed and believes and therefore allege that the specified public buildings and other facilities administered by the SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT are buildings, structures or related facilities within the meaning of California Government Code \$\$4450 and 4451. PLAINTIFF is further informed

and believe and therefore allege that the SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL

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1	DISTRICT, have constructed, altered, or repaired parts of these
2	public buildings and facilities within the meaning of California
3	Government Code §§4450, 4451 and 4456, thereby requiring
4	provision of access to persons with disabilities, as required by
5	law, and statutory attorney fees, litigation expenses and costs,
6	including but not limited to public interest attorney fees
7	pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure § 1021.5.
8	26. The actions and omissions of the SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL
9	DISTRICT as herein alleged constitute a denial of access to and
10	use of the described public educational facilities by physically
11	disabled persons within the meaning of California Government Code
12	§4450 et seq. As a proximate result of Defendants' action and
13	omissions Defendants have discriminated against PLAINTIFF, in
14	violation of California Government Code §§4450 et seq., and of
15	Title 24 regulations adopted to implement section 4450.
16	27. PLAINTIFF has no adequate remedy at law, and
17	unless the relief requested herein is granted, PLAINTIFF will

suffer irreparable harm as a result of Defendants' failure to fulfill their obligations to provide full and equal access to the Soquel Preschool Nursery, programs, services and activities.

Wherefore, PLAINTIFF prays the court grant relief as requested, hereinbelow.

FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION:

FOR VIOLATION OF CALIFORNIA'S

CIVIL RIGHTS ACTS (§§54 and 54.1 CIVIL CODE)

PLAINTIFF repleads and incorporates by reference,

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contained in Paragraphs 1 through 27 of this complaint and incorporates them herein as if separately repled.

- 29. The premises at SANTA CRUZ SCHOOL DISTRICT, above described, constitute public accommodations within the meaning of Government Code \$4450 et seq., and are facilities to which members of the public are invited. The aforementioned acts and omissions of Defendants and each of them constitute a denial of equal access to and use and enjoyment of these facilities by persons with disabilities including PLAINTIFF, ERNESTINA SALDANANEILY. Said acts and omissions are also in violation of provisions of Title 24 of the California Administrative Code.
- 30. Commencing one year prior to the filing of this lawsuit, on each date that plaintiff was required to attend parenting classes and/or volunteer at the Soquel Preschool Nursery, and on the dates specified hereinabove, PLAINTIFF suffered violations of \$\$54 and 54.1 Civil Code in that she was denied "full and free use" and "full and equal access" to public buildings, public walkways, public facilities, and programs, services and activities conducted by defendants on the basis that she was a parent with a disability.
- 31. As a result of the denial of full and equal access to the facilities by Defendants and each of them, PLAINTIFF suffered a violation of her Civil Rights including but not limited to rights under §§54, 54.1 and 54.3 of California Civil Code, suffered physical personal injuries, physical discomfort, emotional distress, embarrassment, and humiliation, all to her damages as hereinabove and hereinafter stated.
 - 32. PLAINTIFF seeks damages for the violation of her

rights as a disabled person as specified hereinabove and
continuing to the present date and until proper access is
provided, in all respects requested, according to proof.
PLAINTIFF requests injunctive relief per §55 Civil Code, to
require provision of facilities which provide full and equal
access per §§54 and 54.1 Civil Code. PLAINTIFF also requests ar
award of attorneys' fees, litigation expenses and costs pursuant
to §§54.3 and 55 Civil Code, as well as the damage remedies,
including treble damages, available pursuant to §54.3 Civil Code.
Wherefore, PLAINTIFF prays the court grant relief as
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requested hereinbelow.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, PLAINTIFF prays that this Court:

- 1. Issue a preliminary and permanent injunction directing Defendants to modify the specified public buildings and other non-conforming facilities and their policies and practices, so that each provides full and equal access physically disabled persons;
- 2. Retain jurisdiction over the Defendants until such time as the Court is satisfied that Defendants' unlawful policies, practices, acts and omissions complained of herein no longer exist, and will not, recur;
- 5. Grant a jury trial and award to PLAINTIFF all appropriate damages in an amount to be proved at trial;
- 6. Award to PLAINTIFF all costs of this proceeding and award all statutory remedies including statutory attorneys' fees, litigation expenses and costs, as provided by law; and

1	7. Grant such other and further relief as this Court
