Dear Sirs:

Please be advised that I'm requesting that you issue an order to enforce the proper payment and execution of a Settlement Document I signed with my attorney Laura A. Feldman, Esq. of the Feldman & Pinto Law Firm on Nov 19, 2009.

I do seriously believe that an order is warranted in this matter, because the terms of the Settlement Conditions have been breached. On the above stated case, I retained the services of Feldman & Pinto Law Firm, formerly of Trenton, New Jersey, now located in Philadelphia, Pa.

I was diagnosed with an illness in the prison system in late 2001 and retained the Feldman & Pinto Law Firm in 2002 to represent me in my case against (CMS) Correctional Medical Services because of failure to provide treatment along with a number of other complaints. The case was filed under the above Bennett, et al. v. CMS, et al. in both class action and individual complaints.

In the past (8) eight years of this case many clients were dropped for reasons our attorneys felt legally necessary. However Walter Bennett and myself Gregory M. Royal were not dropped, but ended up in a settlement agreement. Unbeknown to myself, my attorneys had brought in another firm to argue the settlement.

I've never met nor have I spoken with these other attorneys, our only means of correspondence was by way of mail. From the very beginning we experienced some disagreements on the distribution of my funds in the settlement.

To date I have not been paid a dime, Daniel S. Weinstock of the Feldman Shepherd Law Firm 1845 Walnut St. 25th floor, Philadelphia, Pa. is the attorney used by my attorney to handle the

settlement. I have reason to believe that this attorney has indeed received my payment from CMS Correctional Medical Services, because Bennett has already been paid, yet I have not, the reason I understand is because I will not grant permission to review my personal credit history which is not in the agreement I signed.

However when my wife call to inquire about my settlement payment the secretary for Mr. Weinstock gives so many reasons that doesn't appear legitimate for them not to give me a Valid reason for not receiving payment of my settlement.

Walter Bennett and myself, Gregory Royal, settled this case for the exact same amount, Bennett Has been paid, which makes me believe that CMS made the payment to Daniel S. Weinstock, But for some reason I've not received my payment.

I signed this Settlement Document in good faith, agreeing to the General Release and Settlement Conditions in the terms of the agreement. I believe the agreement has been breached, because I Refuse to release access to my personal credit history.

If payment was made to Bennett, then it should have been made to me as well, with no questions asked.

I signed into a legal and binding contract, even that amount could never pay for the many years of pain and suffering I've endured with this Chronic Illness which I continue to live with today. For the reasons I've explained in this letter/complaint I request that Your Honors issue an order Enforcing the payment agreed on in my settlement or increase the amount for damages due to non payment.
