PAUL JOSEPH MYERS, JR., FBI # 141 497 J6, was confined at the Wyandotte County Jail, Kansas City, Kansas, from August, 1971, to February, 1972. In December, 1971, MYERS observed Warden PACHECO strike one immate after attempted escape and in January, 1972, observed assault upon Immate JOHNNY ANDERSON by two immates. In October, 1971, MYERS knew of sexual assault upon Immate ROBERT CARTER. PACHECO never made any statements to MYERS regarding any "cover up". GARY POWELL told MYERS he had been placed in Boy's Tark to show blacks and whites could live together. Jail problems were brought about by immates in opinion of MYERS.
