

- 1. Dale Hyde will be allowed by the prison to attend religious meetings of Jehovah's Witnesses on the same conditions as adherents to other similar in situated groups are allowed.
 - A. When it is consistent with sound, legitimate prison magement, Hyde and other Jehovah's Witnesses may meet when fewer than fifteen of them are attending if other religious groups are allowed to meet in groups smaller than fifteen. The limit of fifteen was set as the argest minimum attendance level that the prison could lawfully set; the order does not prohibit the prison from allowing smaller meetings.
 - B. When it is consistent with sound, legitimate prison management, Hyde and other Jehovah's Witnesses may meet without an approved religious volunteer to conduct the meeting if none is reasonably available to attend a regularly scheduled meeting.
- 2. Dale Hyde will be allowed not to work for ten work days, at I the prison will credit him for good time as if he had worked during this time.
- This order in not in derogation of the existing consent dec ee about prison desegregation and religious practices entered in Lamar v. Cof eld, No. 72 Civ. 1383 (S.D. Tex. July 1977).
- 4. This is a final judgment.
