## ORDER

Pending before the Court in this action are motions by the United States scaking findings of contempt for the Defendants' alleged failure to comply with several Orders of this Court directing the Defendants to take certain actions to provide adequate conditions of confinement at Golden Grove Adult Correctional Center. The parties have conferred and agree that the Plan of Correction proposed by the experts for the United States on March 22, 1989, should be adopted by the Court and that the Consent Decree should be extended for two and one half years beyond the date of the adoption of the Plan. Because the Plan was originally proposed over one year ago, the parties further agree that changes in the due dates set forth in the Plan are appropriate. Compliance by the Defendants with this Order will purge any alleged contempt currently before the Court. Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED THAT:

1. The Plan of Correction is hereby amended to reflect the timeline attached to this Order;

- 2. The Plan, as amended, is hereby adopted as an Order of this Court;
- 3. The Consent Decree is hereby extended to a contemplated termination date two and one-half years from the date of this Order (October 11, 1992); and
- 4. Termination of the Consent Decree will be in accordance with {{V.2, V.4, and V.5 of the Consent Decree.
