STIPULATION AND CONSENT JUDGMENT

NOW INTO COURT, through undersigned counsel come Sidney J. Barthelemy, Mayor of the City of New Orleans, Stuart Walker, Chief Administrative Officer, City of New Orleans, Dorothy Mae Taylor, Councilwoman-At-Large, Joseph J. Giarrusso, Councilman-At-Large, Peggy Wilson, Councilwoman District A, James Singleton, Councilman District B, Mike Early, Councilman District C, Lambert Boissiere, Jr., Councilman District D, Johnny Jackson, Councilman District E, and Warren G. Woodfork, Chief of Police, City of New Orleans all defendants herein, and Charles C. Foti, Jr., Criminal Sheriff for the Parish of Orleans, plaintiff-mover herein, who with respect stipulate as follows:

I.

The Mayor, the City Council of the City of New Orleans and the other defendants herein desire to have the trial of this matter, currently fixed for April 18, 1990, continued until July 15, 1990.

II.

The parties hereto consent and agree that funding by the City of New Orleans for the jail operations of the Criminal Sheriff will be paid in the same amount, at the same rate and in the same manner for the period of time from the date of this Consent Judgment to July 15, 1990 as has been provided since January 1, 1990 to date of this Judgment, said amount being \$1,250,000 per month.

III.

The parties further hereby consent and agree as follows. The method of funding of the jail operations of the Criminal Sheriff for the Parish of Orleans will no longer be through a lump sum appropriation. Rather, the City of New Orleans shall pay to the Criminal Sheriff for the Parish of Orleans a dollar amount per inmate per day. The determination of this amount is the only issue to be resolved on July 15, 1990 by this Court, although this stipulation shall in no way limit defendants' right to urge the Court to consider any and all factors in determining this per inmate per day amount. This system of payment will begin on July 15, 1990 and will remain in effect unless later amended, altered or modified by judgment of this Court. This method of payment per prisoner per day will be as follows. The Sheriff will invoice the City every two weeks for payment in accordance with the number of inmates housed by him for the preceding two weeks and the City will make payment within two weeks after receipt of the invoice. Defendants will have the right to documentation to verify the inmate population during each invoice period. The City will be responsible for payment for each inmate for which the Sheriff is not otherwise paid by the State of Louisiana or the United States Government.
