ORDERED that the Bureau shall, within 90 days of the issuance of this Order, submit a new or supplemental <u>Vaughn</u> index meeting the specifications set forth in the Memorandum Opinion issued by the Court on this same date. It is further

ORDERED that the plaintiff, should it continue to object to the defendant's reliance on FOIA exemptions to withhold or redact records responsive to its FOIA request after receiving the updated <u>Vaughn</u> index, shall move for summary judgment within 45 days of the filing of the new or supplemental <u>Vaughn</u> index. It is further

ORDERED that the defendant shall file its opposition and cross-motion for summary judgment no later than 30 days after the filing of the plaintiff's motion. It is further

ORDERED that the plaintiff shall file its opposition to the defendant's cross-motion for summary judgment no later than fifteen days after that motion is filed.
