Sheriff Foti sought a conference this morning in order to call to the attention of the court and the parties that certain aspects of the conditions of confinement consent decree may need modification based upon the constraints of the new Templeman III facility in which he is currently housing prisoners. More specifically, the exercise areas of that facility are indoor gymnasium type facilities rather than outdoor facilities called for by the consent decree. In addition, the Sheriff advised that, as to Templeman I and II, there are currently plans to close in exercise areas of those facilities as well so that they may likewise be considered indoor operations. The Sheriff brought with him plans for examination by counsel and the court pertaining to each facility.

The court advised Sheriff Foti's counsel to file a motion to amend the consent decree in order to bring it into conformity with the situation as it now exists in Templeman III and to address the proposed changes in Templeman I and II. Absent a specific request, the court will decide the issues raised on the pleadings filed without oral argument or an evidentiary hearing.
