Dear Mr. Snook:

I am writing to inform you that the United States Department of Justice intends to investigate conditions at the Washington County Detention Center, pursuant to the Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1977 et seq.

The purpose of the investigation is to determine whether conditions in the Detention Center violate the constitutional rights of its inmates. The investigation will focus on suicide prevention, but will also cover allegations of overcrowding and unsanitary conditions; inadequate medical care, nutrition, and opportunities for exercise; lack of access to the courts resulting from an inadequate law library; physical and verbal abuse by staff; and failure to respond to inmate grievances. In initiating this investigation, we have not prejudged that the facility violates inmates' constitutional rights. If we do find any violations, we will confer with you and your staff about appropriate corrective action.

We will endeavor to coordinate this investigation with relevant officials in Washington County. We will be in touch with your staff to work out the specifics of our investigation.
