ORDER

Before the Court is the joint motion of the plaintiff, the United States of America (the "United States"), and the defendants, the Territory of the Virgin Islands (the "Virgin Islands") and the Virgin Islands Police Department (the "VIPD"), to modify certain timelines found in the Consent Decree in this

matter. The premises considered, it is hereby

ORDERED that Paragraphs 96 and 98 of the March 23, 2009

Consent Decree are amended to read as follows:

Paragraph 96 of the Consent Decree:

The Monitor shall issue quarterly written, public reports detailing the Territory of the Virgin Islands' compliance with and implementation of each substantive provision of this Agreement. These reports shall be written with due regard for the privacy interests of individual officers and the interest of the Territory and the VIPD in protecting against disclosure of nonpublic information. At least ten (10) business days before filing a report, the Monitor shall provide a copy of the draft to the parties for input as to whether any factual errors were made or whether any sensitive data or non-public information is disclosed. The Monitor shall consider the parties' responses and make appropriate changes, if any, before issuing the report. The Monitor may testify in this case regarding any matter relating to the implementation, enforcement or dissolution of this Agreement.

Paragraph 98 of the Consent Decree:

Beginning April 7th, 2010, and no later than every three months thereafter until this Agreement is terminated, the VIPD shall file with the Monitor and Virgin Islands Attorney General's Office, with a copy to the DOJ, a status report delineating the steps taken by the VIPD during the reporting period to comply with each provision of this Agreement. The VIPD shall also file such a report documenting the steps taken to comply with each provision of this Agreement during the term of this Agreement 120 days before the end of the Agreement's term.
