
**ORDER**

On August 30, 2013, Microsoft Corporation and Google Inc. (together, "the Providers") filed a consent motion for "a 10-day stay of the proceedings so as to permit the Providers to file . . . amended motions" for declaratory relief "and to avoid the Government having to respond more than once to the Providers' requests for declaratory relief." That motion further requested "that the Court vacate its scheduling orders of August 19, 2013" and stated that the "parties will file a proposed briefing schedule in conjunction with the filing of the Providers' amended motions for declaratory relief." The motion further represented that "the Government consents to the proposed stay requested herein."

Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED as follows:

- (1) Microsoft Corporation and Google Inc. shall file any amended motions for declaratory relief no later than 5:00 pm on September 9, 2013, through the Security and Emergency Planning Staff, U.S. Department of Justice. Such filing shall also include the parties' proposed briefing schedule.
- (2) The scheduling orders issued in the above-captioned dockets on August 19, 2013, are rescinded.
