REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION OF UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE

The class action allegations of plaintiffs' amended complaint were referred to the undersigned United States

Magistrate for review and a recommended disposition pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §636(b).

Plaintiffs Robert E. Bullington, Steven L. Toney, Glen Reynolds and Michael Clark seek an order permitting them to maintain this action as a class action on behalf of all persons who are detained at the St. Louis County Jail who are awaiting trial on alleged criminal offenses against the State of Missouri. By their allegations they invoke Rule 23(a), (b)(1)(B), and (b)(2), Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. The matter came on for hearing on January 9, 1980 and the parties, by counsel, offered written and oral stipulations of fact.

After considering the allegations of the complaint and the stipulations of counsel the undersigned makes the following findings:

The class is so numerous that joinder of all members is impracticable, there being in excess of 50 pre-trial detainees currently incarcerated in the St. Louis County Jail. One of the

purported class representatives, Robert E. Bullington, remains incarcerated as a pre-trial detainee at the St. Louis County Jail. There are questions of fact and law common to the class. The claims of the representatives of the class are typical of the claims of the class. The representative parties through their counsel will fairly and adequately protect the interests of the class. See Fed.R.Civ.Pro. 23(a). The prosecution of separate actions by or against individual members of the class would create a risk of adjudications with respect to individual members of the class which would as a practical matter be dispositive of the interests of the other members not parties to the adjudications or substantially impede or impair their ability to protect their interests. See Fed.R.Civ.Pro. 23(b)(1)(B). The parties opposing the class have acted or refused to act on grounds generally applicable to the class thereby making appropriate final injunctive relief or corresponding declaratory relief with respect to the class as a whole. See Fed.R.Civ.Pro. 23(b)(2).

RECOMMENDATION

For the reasons set out above, it is the recommendation of the undersigned United States Magistrate that

- (1) this action be maintained as a class action pursuant to Rule 23(a), (b)(1), and (b)(2);
- (2) the subject class be defined as all persons who are detained, or have been detained, or will be detained at the St. Louis County Jail, State of Missouri, awaiting trial on alleged offenses against the State of Missouri;
- (3) the Court reserve the right to alter or eliminate the class aspects of this action or to impose further conditions to its maintenance as a class action if upon further hearings

and upon further evidence adduced this Court believes that such alteration, elimination or conditions are necessary in order to properly protect the interests of the class. See Fed.R.Civ.Pro. 23(c)(1). The parties shall have ten days within which to file written objections to this Report and Recommendation.
