DEFENDANT'S MOTION TO AMEND ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDY PROGRAM FOR MEDICAL COMPLAINTS

NOW INTO COURT, represented by undersigened counsel, comes the Mississippi Department of Corrections Commissioner Christopher B. Epps, who respectfully represents as follows:

I.

On February 15, 1994 Chief United States District Court Judge L. T. Senter signed an Order certifying the Adm inistrative Rem edy Program (ARP) for the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC).

II.

Since that time, MDOC has contracted with medical service providers to provide medical care to its inmates.

III.

MDOC desires Court approval for a sp ecific process dealing with m edical complaints filed by inmates within the MDOC.

IV.

Specifically, MDOC desires for all inm ate medical complaints to be an swered at Step One of the ARP by the on site senior medical director employed by the contractor.

V.

Step Two of m edical com plaints will be ans wered by the regiona 1 m edical director for the contractor.

VI.

Step Three medical complaints will be answered by the MDOC Comm issioner of Corrections with input from the MDOC medical director.

VII.

This process will allow consideration by licensed medical professionals on all medical complaints of inmates.

VIII.

MDOC prays for this to be implemented as soon as approved by the Court.

IX.

MDOC prays f or ARP rules to be drafted for medical complaints that comply with this pleading as soon as Court approval is obtained.

X.

The new amended plan will ass ist the MDOC medical director in monitoring the medical care provided to MDOC inmates under the medical contract.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Defendants move this Honorable Court to amend the Administrative Remedy Program Order for Medical Complaints, and grant any other relief deemed necessary and proper under the circumstances.
