> Investigation of the Jackson City Jail in Jackson, Mississippi

Dear Mayor Ditto:

I am writing to inform you of our intention to investigate conditions at the Jackson City Jail ("JCJ") in Jackson, Mississippi. The investigation is pursuant to the Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act, 42 U.S.C. §1997-1997j (1982).

The purpose of the investigation will be to determine whether JCJ violates the constitutional rights of its inmates. The investigation will focus on, among other things, allegations concerning (1) conditions of confinement, (2) supervision by guards, (3) suicide precautions, (4) medical care, and (5) various structural deficiencies. Initiating this investigation in no way evidences any prejudgment that JCJ violates its inmates' constitutional rights. If any violations are found, however, we will confer with you and your staff concerning appropriate corrective actions.

As a means of commencing this investigation, we wish to arrange for our attorneys, consultants, and perhaps agents of the

Federal Bureau of Investigation to visit and tour JCJ. We shall be in touch with your staff to work out the specifics of our initial investigation.
