The above-entitled matter comes before the Court upon Defendant's objection to the Report and Recommendation of United States Chief Magistrate Judge Arthur J. Boylan dated December 28, 2010 granting Plaintiffs' motion for summary judgment as to the Invalidity of the SIRP Releases and denying Defendants' motion for summary judgment regarding all claims asserted by Plaintiff Paul Calcagno. 2. Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment Regarding All Claims

Asserted by Plaintiff Paul Calcagno [Doc. No. 220] is DENIED.
