There were about 15 or 20 persons applying. Almost everyone was helping each other in completing their application forms. His wife and J. C. Law helped him. None of the registrars gave him any help. He did not know the number of his ward or precinct and someone furnished it to him. Someone also furnished him with an answer to Q. 20 on his form ("Name some of the duties and obligations of citizenship"). When he finished he was given a registration certificate. (See Pl. Ex. 6)

Testimony

About 15 or 20 persons were in the room either waiting to apply or applying for registration to vote. While she waited and while she was filling out her form she observed the man who gave out the forms and

three other ladies help those persons applying answer the questions on their forms. The man who gave her the form told her when she got to a question she did not understand to call him. There were many parts of the application she didn't understand and the man who gave her the form explained questions to her and told her how she should answer them. After she had finished and the man who had given her the form had examined it, he told her where to sign and she signed her form. She did not sign her name where it appears next to the crossed out signature on page three of her form in the Supplemental Application. She was instructed to take her form to the tax assessor in the Courthouse and have him sign as her supporting witness. She took her form out of the office where she registered to the tax assessor, who she knows, and he signed her form in his office when no registrar was present. While she was registering she saw other persons being told to take their applications outside and get someone to sign them as their supporting witness. After she returned her form to the registrars she was given a certificate of registration. (See P1. Ex. 5)

Testimony:

She was given an application form by a registrar and told that if she did not understand the questions, he would explain them to her. The registrar showed her where to sign her name on the form. All three of the registrars, two men and one woman, sat at the table with her when she filled out her form. One other person, a white person was also applying. The witness asked what some of the questions meant. One of these questions was what Q.20 meant ("Name some of the duties and obligations of citizenship.") The registrar told her to put down "Constitution of the United States" as the answer to that question. When she finished she returned her form

to the registrars who looked over her application. They told her she must have misread Q.19 (relating to giving comfort to the enemies of the United States Government or the government of the State of Alabama) and Q.20a (relating to whether the applicant regards the duties and obligations which he listed as having priority over the duties and obligation he owes to any other secular organization when they are in conflict). The registrar told her to read them over again. She reread these questions and changed her answers from incorrect to correct answers. After she returned her form to them she received a certificate of registration and was told she had to pay her poll tax before she could vote and was told where to pay it. (See Pl. Ex. 5)

and the Constitution of the State of Alabama"). He thinks they spelled out the word "Constitution" for him in helping him answer Q.20. When he finished he was given a certificate of registration. testified in the trial of this case.)

The answer to Q.20 on his form is, "Defend the Constitution and obey the laws." (See Pl. Ex. 5)

She applied at the Courthouse and sat at a long table and filled out her form. An older man, whose name she doesn't know, sat beside her and helped her whenever she had any questions. She had trouble understanding several questions on her form. She answered Q.19, "Yes" but after being helped by the man she changed it to "No" after being told she had answered it incorrectly. She also believes she didn't understand Q.5 relating to her date of residence in the state, county, and precinct and Q.20 relating to some of the duties and obligations of citizenship. When she turned her application in to Registrar Doggett he called her attention to Q.2 which she had answered "Yes". She then changed the answer to "married." Her husband then got James Christopher, the Circuit Clerk, to sign as her supporting witness. She does not know him except for having seen him once or twice. After she was finished she was given a certificate of registration and told by a registrar that she should pay her poll tax. (Pl. Ex. 6)

They spelled out the word "Constitution" for him when they told him what to put down. They also told him where to sign his name on his form. (Witness testified at trial of case).

He filled out his form at his mother-in-law's store at lunch time. He believed the board of registrars was working at the Rock Springs Community Center that day and were at the store for lunch. He did not write the answer to Q.3(20) relating to the duties and obligations of citizenship. The answer on his form is - "Defend the Constitution of U.S. and the laws of America." His mother-in-law wrote this for him and he doesn't know where she got the answer. After she wrote this the registrars told her he had to fill out his own form. Two registrars were present when he filled out his form. He asked them to explain some of the questions as he went along filling out the form. They explained the questions to him but he doesn't recall them giving him the answers. After he finished the registrars gave him a certificate of registration. (Pl. Ex. 5)

He asked the man about Q.17(20) relating to the duties and obligations of citizenship and the man told him to put down - "defend the Constitution of the United States." He gave the form to the man who gave him a registration certificate. This man told him where to go and pay his poll tax. (Witness testified at the trial of this case.)

she didn't understand and he told her what it meant. She had trouble with Q.5(20) relating to the duties and obligations of citizenship and after writing, "To stand for truth and right in all matters," she asked the registrar what would be the best way to word the The registrar told her, "To defend the Constituanswer. tion of the United States and the State of Alabama" and she then added that to her answer. In order to answer C.10(5) relating to when she became a bona fide resident of the state she asked her husband for the date she became a bona fide resident. She asked the registrar for the answer to Q.10(5b) relating to when she became a bona fide resident of her precinct and what her precinct number is. She gave her husband help in filling out his form but she cannot remember what she specifically helped him with. (Her husband, Lathan Long, has a 5th grade education.) She listed as her reference in answer to 0.6(21) her father-in-law, T. E. Long, who also vouched for her. She did not write "James Christopher, Butler, Ala." who is listed as her second reference. She does not know who wrote this or when it was written. After turning in her application she received a certificate of registration. (P1. Ex. 5)

Testimony:

He has only a third grade education but he learned to read and write at home after he had become a man. He reads the papers and leads a Sunday School Class. The witness applied for registration to vote eighteen different times with the Board. All of his applications were rejected. He first tried at Wantley when the registrars were registering in the precinct and all other times he tried at the Courthouse in Butler, Alabama.

All of his experiences were about the same. He would go into the office and the manager would tell him he didn't pass on his last application so he would get another application and fill it out. He did not ask what he did wrong on his applications.

The registrars would not let them talk to one another while they were filling out their forms. All of his applications have been rejected and he is not registered to vote.

On cross-examination the witness stated that he had written sixth grade down on several of his forms. He stated this was a mistake that he had only gone to the third grade in school. TABLE C

ANALYSIS OF ACCEPTED APPLICATIONS November 9, 1959 to February 5, 1963

This table sets forth an analysis of those accepted applications, which contain errors or omissions, filed with the current Board of Registrars. The applications are listed chronologically according to the date of application.

The analysis of these 190 applications filed by white persons show that the applications were accepted regardless of the errors or omissions on them.

All accepted applications filed by Negroes, which total 42 since November 9, 1959 are analyzed on pages 20 and 21 of this table. This analysis shows that Negroes must file virtually perfect application forms to be accepted for registration, although less than ten of these accepted applications contain an error or omission for which other Negro applicants have been rejected. (See Table D)

^{1/} The accepted application forms were all filled out properly except for the errors or omissions listed herein. When a question on the application form is cited followed by a number in parenthesis the latter refers to the number of the question on the blank application forms found before Table A and following page 5 in the Brief. (All application forms are identical except the questions in the Questionnaire are arranged in twenty different sequences.)

Among abbreviations in the analysis "App. for Reg." refers to the three blank spaces in the Application for Registration at the top of page 1 of the form and "Supp" refers to the Supplemental Application for Registration, and Oath at the bottom of page 3 on the form. Some applicants list only one address in answer to Q.1, which calls for the address and place of birth of the applicant. When it cannot be determined from the form as a whole whether the address represents both the address and place of birth or which of the two it does represent, the form is analyzed - "Address or place of birth omitted."

#### TABLE D

This table sets forth an analysis of 45 rejected applications filed by Negroes with the current Board of Registrars. The applications are listed chronologically by the date of application.

These applications show that Negroes are rejected for highly technical and inconsequential errors and omissions on their application forms. A supporting witness completed the Examination for the Supporting Witness section on all of the forms listed in this table. All applications listed herein show that the applicants meet the substantive qualifications for registration to vote - citizenship; age; sufficient residence in state, county and precinct; literacy; nonconvictions; that they embrace the duties and obligations of citizenship; and that they are of good character.

^{1 /} All of the application forms listed herein are filled out properly except for the errors or omissions listed. When a question on the application form is cited, followed by a number in parenthesis the latter refers to the number of the question on the blank application forms found before Table A and following page 5 in the Brief. (All application forms are identical except the que stions in the Questionnaire are arranged in twenty different sequences). Among the abbreviations in the analysis, "App. for Reg." refers to the three blank spaces in the Application for Registration at the top of page 1 of the form and "Supp" refers to the Supplemental Application for Registration, and Oath at the bottom of page 3 on the form. Some applicants list only one address in answer to Q. 1; which calls for the address and place of birth of the applicant. When it cannot be determined from the form as a whole whether the address represents both the address and place of birth or which of the two it does represent, the form's analyzed - "address or place of birth omitted." The terms "Unfinished," "Incomplete," "Disqualified" and "Rejected" were written by the registrar in reviewing the applications. All have the same meaning - rejection because the forms are not filled out properly. (See p. 10 of Brief.)

All applications of Negroes rejected by the current board have been rejected on the grounds that this application forms were not filled out properly or because the forms failed to show the applicants to be qualified. (See p. 9 of Brief).

Information on the Number of Registered Voters by Race from the Records of the Probate Judge.

This exhibit sets forth information which is contained in the set of books maintained by the Probate Judge of Choctaw County which lists all currently registered voters in Choctaw County, Alabama.

These books show that as of February 5, 1963, there were 3,998 persons registered to vote in Choctaw County; that of these 3,998 registrants, 3,509 are white persons, 172 are Negroes and 317 are persons whose race is not identified in these books.

Attachment A to Exhibit 1 lists the names, addresses and dates of registration of the 172 currently registered Negroes. Attachment C lists the names, addresses and dates of registration of 45 Negroes who were listed as registered to vote until they failed to re-identify themselves in the recent voter re-identification. Also the race of an applicant's spouse may be listed in the registration books. Registrar Keahey stated she knows of no Negro who has acted as the supporting witness for a white applicant since November 1959, and the race of all Negroes who have been supporting witnesses is ascertained from the registration records in evidence.

The accepted applications filed by Negroes from 1952 to November, 1959 are marked "Colored," "Col" or "C." That these designations on the applications were used to designate Negro applicants is substantiated by the current list of registered voters maintained by the Judge of Probate. All of those persons who registered from 1952 to 1959 whose applications contained the above designations and whose names appear on the current registered voters list, appear on that list as Negroes. None of the rejected applications filed prior to November, 1959 are available.

# The Application Form was not Used as an Examination or a Test for White Persons Between 1952 and 1959

It is apparent from the accepted applications filed with the Boards of Registrars between January 1952 and November 1959 that the application form was not used as an examination for applicants. Applications were accepted and the applicants registered even though their forms contained numerous errors and omissions. For examples, see the following application forms in Plaintiff's Exhibit A:
