Dear Mr. Donahoe:

I am writing to inform you of our intention to investigate conditions at the Sunflower County Jail ("SCJ") in Indianola, Mississippi. The investigation is pursuant to the Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act, 42 U.S.C. §1997-1997j (1982).

The purpose of the investigation will be to determine whether SCJ violates the constitutional rights of its inmates. The investigation will focus on, among other things, allegations concerning (1) structural deficiencies, (2) conditions of confinement, and (3) lack of adequate fire-safety precautions. Initiating this investigation in no way evidences any prejudgment that SCJ violates its inmates' constitutional rights. If any violations are found, however, we will confer with you and your staff concerning appropriate corrective actions.

As a means of commencing this investigation, we wish to arrange for our attorneys, consultants, and perhaps agents of the

Federal Bureau of Investigation to visit and tour SCJ. We shall be in touch with your staff to work out the specifics of our initial investigation.
