Re: July 6, 1967, negotiations with Local 212,
IBEW, Cincinnati, Ohio

I spoke to Mr. Robert Wehmann, business agent of Local 212, at 7:00 p.m. In accord with our arrangements at the afternoon negotiations, I specified the following as to records which we would wish to examine and analyze:

I. Competency Examination, March 30, 1966

A. The names and application forms of the 288 people whom they had informed us had applied to take such an examination since the time the last examination was given.

B. Copies of the certified letter sent to each of the above.

C. The names of the 69 individuals who were actually examined.

D. A list of those who passed and those who failed.

E. A list of those in this group who are presently working or who have worked since the examination.

F. The names of all those who are going to be re-tested or who have been re-tested for actual union membership as journeymen.

II. Work Permits

- A. The names of all people who are on work permits.
- B. The names of the contractors employing them.
- C. A specification of when, where, and how long they have worked under these permits.

III. Apprenticeship

- A. The names of all apprentices.
- B. Copies of the tests, oral and written.
- C. Copies of any application forms filled out by these apprentices.
- D. Copies of all other application forms filled out by anyone for the apprenticeship program.

IV. Other Applicants

- A. The names and application forms of anyone else who applied at any time for membership in the union as an apprentice, and copies of any and all other tests administered to them.

V. Work Referral

- A. Any records which reflect information about those being referred to work through the union hiring hall.

VI. Public Relations

A. All literature advising what is necessary to get into an apprenticeship program, or into union membership outside of the apprenticeship program.

I arranged with Mr. Wehmann to meet him at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, July 7, 1967, at his office in the Brotherhood Building, 1015 Vine Street.
