DECLARATION OF ROY HODGE, ESQ.

Declaration of Roy Hodge, Esq.

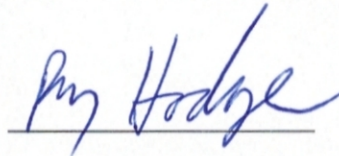
I, Roy Hodge, make the following declaration under the penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States:

- 1) I am an attorney licensed by the state of Michigan currently practicing law in Michigan.
- 2) Aqel M. Aziz, who was born in Yemen, is a current client for whom I have done immigration work.
- 3) I assisted Mr. Aziz in becoming a naturalized US citizen. He obtained his U.S. citizenship on September 24, 2014. Exhibit A is a true and accurate copy of his naturalization certificate.
- 4) Once Mr. Aziz became a US citizen, I assisted him in applying for immigrant visas for his two sons, Tareq and Ammar, who were both then residing in Yemen.
- 5) We began the process by filing an I-130 application on April 21, 2015. Exhibit B is a true and accurate copy of the I-130 approval notice for Tareq. Exhibit C is a true and accurate copy of the I-130 approval notice for Ammar.
- 6) During the process, the United States embassy in Sanaa, Yemen was closed due to a civil war that still rages on to this day.
- 7) Consequently, the US embassy in Djibouti began processing immigrant visas for Yemeni nationals.
- 8) On November 27, 2016, Tareq and Ammar were finally scheduled for visa interviews. Exhibits D and E are true and accurate copies of the brothers' visa interview notices.
- 9) However, prior to the interview dates, there was a cholera outbreak in Yemen prompting the Djibouti government to suspend all travel from Yemen to Djibouti.
- 10) Eventually the Yemeni government convinced the Djibouti government to allow people to resume travel as long as they were medically cleared to be cholera free.
- 11) Due to these extra procedures, the two brothers were not able to reach Djibouti until December 5, 2016.
- 12) The American embassy rescheduled the brothers' interview for January 4, 2017. Exhibits F and G are true and accurate copies of the brothers' rescheduled visa interview notices.
- 13) Both brothers were approved for immigrant visas (category IR2) as evidenced by embassy personnel retaining their passports after said interview and affixing immigrant visas to the passports. I have not personally seen copies of those immigrant visas.,

- 14) Tareq received his passport back within a few days, while the embassy retained Ammar's passport for "additional processing."
- 15) Ammar's passport was finally returned to him on January 26, 2017.
- 16) On January 27, 2017, as soon as Tareq and Ammar both had their passports in their possession, their father booked them on the first available flight to the United States. Under the ordinary course of business, they would have been admitted to the United States as lawful permanent residents (in other words, they would have become lawful permanent residents of the United States immediately upon their admission to the United States, although their actual "green cards," in the form of wallet-sized plastic cards, would take a few weeks to arrive in the mail).
- 17) Upon arrival at Dulles International Airport on the morning of Saturday January 28, 2017, they were both refused admission due to President Trump's executive order, and had their immigrant visas stamped "CANCELLED," and they were sent back to the country of origin where they currently reside.
- 18) I am aware of no facts or reasons why Tareq or Ammar would be inadmissible to the United States, or why their immigrant visas would be in any way invalid or voidable.
- 19) If the immigrant visas of Tarq and Ammar remain cancelled, they will have to start over from square one – i.e., their father would need to file a new I-130. The process would likely take over a year. By then, they will have aged out of eligibility pursuant to the Child Status Protection Act, and will no longer be classified as immediate relatives pursuant to the Immigration and Nationality Act; rather, they will be "F-1" category, which has a backlog of many years.
