WE THE UNDERSIGNED REQUEST THE CAMPBELL COUNTY JAILER AND THE CAMPBELL COUNTY FISCAL COURT TO END THE OVERCROWDING AT THE CAMPBELL COUNTY JAIL. 45202 573 639-700

THERE ARE OFTEN 15 AND 16 MEN IN 8 MAN CELLS. 7 MEN HAVE TO SLEEP ON THE FLOOR ON WORN AND DIRTY MATTRESSES. OFTEN THOSE SLEEPING ON THE FLOOR DO NOT HAVE SHEETS.

THERE ARE MEN SLEEPING RIGHT NEXT TO THE ONE TOILET IN THE 8 MAN CELL. THOSE THAT SLEEP ON THE FLOOR OFTEN GET WET FROM THE SHOWER.

THE SHOWERS HAVE MOLD AND THE TOILET IN CELL 220 HAS HAD A LEAK. ALSO, THE DRAINAGE IN 220 IS OVERTAXED AND BACKS UP.

THE PORTIONS FOR MEALS FOR INMATES HAS BEEN REDUCED ON OCCASION TO ACCOMMODATE THE OVERCROWDING.

TOILETRIES AND SANITATION SUPPLIES, INCLUDING TOILET PAPER ARE IN SHORT SUPPLY.

WE RESPECTFULLY ASK THAT THE OVERCROWDING BE ENDED, AND THAT THE JAIL CEASE ADMITTING NEW INMATES UNTIL THE POPULATION IS REDUCED TO 130.

Denial of Medical attention, all depends on who you are. Personally, when I was in isolation for 20 days I was subject to unhealthy and ~~an~~ unsanitary conditions, bloody gauze and staff infections from another inmate. The inmate kept trying to get the C.C.'s attention finally when he did the inmate was denied going to nurses office to get his bandages changed. The guard also said he wasn't changing them so I volunteered to help him out. The guard said he didn't want to get it. Bloody gauzes were flushed down the toilet. I asked to clean the cell with bleach after and was denied, then they served the food, germs were everywhere Charles Brickmridge

Inmates in isolation going hours upon hours without being checked on.

Inmates at times aren't able to get clean uniforms
They never wash blankets

THEY DON'T HAVE ANY GRIEVANCE FORMS AT ALL
AND SAY THEY CAN'T GET ANY

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The guards are really bad about giving other inmates mail to other inmates, also I believe inmates mail is also being tampered with and not mailed out properly. Guards sleeping on and during shifts and nothing never gets done.

Campbell County Detention is taking 25% of inmates money and 75% each day, sometimes they steal money from inmates who are state inmates.

Showers are molded in each cell and mold on the brown shower doors it has been mentioned by inmates and guards, nothing seems to matter as all about the money.

Deputy Winterhell and Deputy Maine are wrestling and kicking and wrestling with inmates.

115C During my altercation with the guards Sgt. Curly came to the Donald Frank Isolation Cell opened the door and instantly started shouting PROFANITY AND RACIAL SLURS He said you filthy bissen you assaulted my guards, your going to get 5 more years and quote this is the truth Charles Breckenridge Charles Breckenridge are other things there are NO COSMETICS FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN men, NO BRUSHES, NO PICKS, NO SCISSORS etc...

My name is THOMAS LOVINS I am a inmate here at the campbell county correctional facility. In Newport Ky. I am writing you in hope of getting help.

I have been a inmate here for 5 ~~month~~ months. Since I have been here the living arrangement here is ^{SPICKABLE} disspickahl. We are an 8 man cell, at this time we have 16 people in our cell. 8 people ~~are~~ sleeping on the floor. we dont have sheets for ^{our} mats some people dont have towels. We have mold in the shower our toilet has a leak. we have a ^{2 MEN} man sleeping within a couple of feet from our toilet, one mans mat gets wet when we use the shower. I have broken out all over my back and chest, I have scales on my head from something in here, this medical staff pretty much refuses getting us medical help. We sign a Doctors list, the doctor never sees us, they charge \$5.00 for signing the list, and \$5.00 for any thing they give you. If you get a headache its \$5.00 for I motrin or 1 tylenol. Dont even ask for dental help. this place is just plane nasty. You would laugh if you seen the tooth brush they give us. They park us in here on top of ~~we~~ each other and take our T.V. from us, so we dont have nothing to do here, and expect us to get a long.

In general I know I broke the law and I am serving my time, but I am human and I feel I should be treated like one.

OVER

We get treated worst ~~than~~ than people in maximum security prisons, Rapist, Killers, ect. . . This place feeds us less than my 12 year old son eats each meal. I have never been so hungry all the time, in my life. I witnessed a man get beat almost to death over a \$1.50 Box of little ~~de~~ Debbie's snack cakes. the worst beating I ever witnessed in my life because he was ~~that~~ hungry. They even tax our STAMPS we buy for our letters.

I could go on for days but I'm not.

just one more thing. When they send state inspectors here they never make it to the back 2nd floor pods were its the worst. I am glad ~~to~~ you have taken the time to listen me and I hope you can help us.

If I can be of any help to you in any way, please contact me here at the C.C.C.D

Jennifer, My name is John M. Rice. I am an inmate here at C C D C. I am currently serving a 1 year sentence and have been incarcerated since October 1st. During my incarceration I have seen many injustices. Among these are inmate over crowding nearly double what the jail is made to hold 15 men in 8 man cells. Men sleeping on old worn out delapidated mats that couldn't be sanitized by any effort, if any were made "which there's not". No sheets. Men sent into population without towels for necks having to borrow others towels or use their jail shirts to dry off with. The cells are rarely cleaned and cant be cleaned properly because of the over crowding. The showers in most cells have black mold and the drainage system is so overtaxed that it backs up quite often our meal portions are even being shortened to make up for the extra inmates, that includes the barely 8 ounces of fluids they give us at each meal. The air and water quality is also very poor and is also overtaxed the cold water is as cloudy as hot water and the air smells like backed up sewer the majority of the day. Laundry is seldom bleached and the blankets we receive on intake are in Motley shape and have never been washed in the 9 months I have been here. Excessive over charging on inmate accounts take forever to fix. Toilettes and Sanitation (shower) supplies are nearly impossible to get and supplies are so short that every and robbery of each others goods are rampant. Everyones ~~nerve~~ ^{are} sorely stressed and Medical Attention is

practically impossible to receive until you have filled out the ~~the~~ ^{two} weekly doctors list many time and that isn't every promise. Just last week 8 out of 15 inmates in this cell alone was out of toilet paper as each person only receives 1 roll to last him a week. They were 2 days late handing it out. It seems like its just straight neglect of this facility to care for its inmates or just lack of concern on the C.O.'s part. They seem to enjoy verbally insulting others and the slight digression on an inmates part (Just I) may have your T.V, commissary or phone shut down for innumerable days. Punish 15 guys for one persons wrongful doing. I'm not blaming all our C.O's, some actually try to do there jobs but it seems like even them bang their heads on the wall trying to get any thing accomplished in their daily task's. It is a terrible mire and the only thing one can think is it starts way up on the totem pole and we are on the bottom wrong, overcharging, over crowding, lack of sanitation, lack of facilities, LACK OF CONCERN. I understand we are prisoners but we are not POW'S we are human. ALL we the inmates would and could expect, is to be treated humanely including some sort of Recreation other than the once or twice a week 1 hour intervals we receive. We also are not all allowed Church or AA and Anger Management is non existant, where in a facility that's all they breed is Anger. I appreciate any thing that you can do personally or professionally to help make this facility just comply with state and federal guidelines as well as Health and Humanity regulation.

I've been writing things down day by day and the guards here are more arrogant than ever. I think that I shouldn't even be here being as I had a confrontation with them. To be honest I thought they were playing around lying as that's what they do on a daily basis. It's a shame all the things that they are getting away with conditions are inhumane. I am very paranoid, they are trying to poison me, and I keep finding hairs in my food.

On February 8, 2005 I was serving chow. When Charles Breckenridge got put in the hole. He was getting his food when Deputy Winterhalt put his hands on top of glass with a finger on the inside of his glass. Breckenridge questioned why he touch his cup without gloves on. Winterhalt then told Breckenridge to take his cup and move. Breckenridge asked for another cup from the deputy. Winterhalt refused him another cup, Then grabbed the cup that Winterhalt and Breckenridge were arguing over and put it on the cart, after passing out chow, we were picking up trays when Deputy Mayne opened the door. Breckenridge asked for some juice. Dept. Mayne laughed and said you should have took your juice the first time. Breckenridge then kicked the trays over. Mayne then called for backup. Deputies Winterhalt and Petri came running to the cell. They came in told him to turn around. When he refused to turn around they tackled him. after being forced to the ground Breckenridge locked his arms in front of him. Shortly after he was handcuffed by Winterhalt, Mayne. at no time did Breckenridge swing at one of the deputies or in anyway do anything to cause harm to no one. I feel like Mr. Breckenridge was treated unfairly.

To Whom it May Concern:

We as inmates of Campbell County Detention Center have been deprived of many things that we feel are our rights as U.S. Citizens. Sanitary Conditions over here are unacceptable, such as inmates in isolation getting showers 1 a week and never getting issued towels or washcloths. Dog tooth-brushes issued to inmates as their own. Never getting to see the Doctor when you sign up for med. call not unless your a favorite or they pick your name and come and get you. Laundry only getting done once every 2 weeks sometimes skipping our indigent days. Sometimes going 2 or 3 weeks without indigent and getting charged for it. Campbell County is taking 25% of all money sent in here, that's 25% a day. Racial Discrimination and Discrimination of other sorts to, such as the rules apply only for certain individuals. Horse playing to guards cuffing inmates up and arm wrestling and wrestling and Kick Boxing with inmates. Many other rights are being violated but noone does anything about it please help us.

I CHARLES Breckonridge have been in isolation cell 214 since Feb 8, 2005 today is Feb 24, 2005. Since I've been in isolation numerous of my rights as well as the rights of others have been violated. They shut the flaps on the door and it's see you when it's time for chow. If I was a sick person I'd probably be dead, honestly that's how often they check on you. When it's time for laundry 214 is skipped over when it's time for doctor's list 214 is skipped over, when it's time for A.A. or church only a select chosen people can go, they don't even ~~inform~~ inform everyone that it's church or A.A., just a select few know about it. Recreation, there is none 24 hour lock down! Law Library is a joke and you never get to go there. On about Tues Feb 14 2005 inmate Michael Clark was put into the hole with a staff infection he was in there for 5 days he called ^{Sgt.} Gurly a dumb M.F. well actually he told deputy Maine and Maine Radioed Gurly and told him what Clark had said just so Clark could go to the hole ^{all} over because Clark wanted his bandages changed. Inmate Clark was put in the hole bleeding and all bandages soaked with blood and we in a 10^{FT} by 8^{FT} isolation cell. Clark tells them about the bandages again and they said change them yourself. He's got iodine and dirty gauze on the table we eat on and throws the dirty ~~blood~~ soaked gauze in the toilet & told them there was a procedure about blood and dealing with it but the deputies weren't trying to hear him or me. I told the deputy to help him and he refused and gave me some rubber

cases. I saw Clark struggling so I assisted him in covering up his wound. Same thing went on for 3 days they never even checked on him or me until it was time for chow. On about the Feb 16, 2005 Brian Turner was put in isolation, that's 3 grown men in a 10^{FT} by 8^{FT} Cell he was in there for 5 days. On Feb. 19, 2005 we had ~~the~~ Corn Flakes for breakfast and just as I suspected all along that someone has been tampering with ~~the~~ ^{my} food I had a hair in my bowl and Turner told Deputy Rollins about it he said to go ahead and eat it. The guards never wear hair nets or gloves when serving food and he touching your food here handed and if you complain, they more than ready to put you in isolation, Deputy Brown said if you dont like the way ^{this} jail is run then stay out of trouble justifying ones Constitutional and Civil and human Rights being violated I still have scars on my wrist from the handcuffs and that happened on Feb. 8th. I never did receive medical assistance. Feb 24, 2005 I just had a conversation with Deputy Wood and he was telling me he's getting ready to leave because of all the bullshit, he said he figured he let me clean being as noone else does their job he said this place has really went downhill since I was here before, he said something bad is going to happen like a riot or guard getting seriously hurt

because of conditions here at the jail, its bad, real bad
he was talking about the shower doors and the mildew that
on them he said he mentioned it to them. I asked him about
other incidents that occurred here and what happened to them
he said its all about who you know. I remember specifically
one incident involving ^{Sgt} Gurly and Scott Miller, Gurly rushed and
tackled Miller because he said he was going to another cell
Miller resisted but nothing was ever charged to him and
the Mark Carter incident when the report was on the news, I
was here nothing was ever charged to him but mines is the
best of all incidents and Jim being charged 20 days in the hole
and 2 3rd degree assaults. Deputy Wood said that's the reason why
the turnover rate in guards is so high because of unfair
treatment to the inmates like Dept Sebastian and Sgt. Hones,
as well as many others Dept. Farley and he was a Prison Guard
at Arizona, he said this place is a joke. Also today laundry was
done and again the went right by my door and never asked
if I wanted to do laundry it is just another thing that
I've been talking about. Feb 25, 2005 at about 9:00pm. Deputy Brown
came around to do laundry I was in ^{cell} 214, he asked cell 211 about
laundry but not cell 214 which I was in, he never even looked
in I would say its about 3:00am and noone has checked on me
for hours. March 7, 2005, I recieved a letter that I sent out

about a 2 months ago. First of all it's been over a month since I been in cell 120 and that's where the letter went to, second they gave my mail to another inmate, that's not the first time, it's pure negligence on behalf of the jail and the guards. March 22, 2005, I just have a few more things of what's going on at this jail, it is a fact that a few days after I got out the hole there was an altercation between Deputy Brown and Donnie Hall and Deputy ~~Brown~~ and inmate hall had words Deputy Brown went to Restrain inmate Hall and inmate Hall jerked away and slapped his glasses off his face and Deputy Brown and inmate Hall wrestled around. Deputy Brown cuffed Hall and took him to the hallway. Minutes later inmate Hall was returned to the cell nothing said, if that's not discrimination I don't know what is. Why wasn't he charged and that's not the only incident. at least helps me to get justice, for once.

On Monday Feb 21, 2005 STATE Inmate Jody Darrell
WAS BROUGHT TO Campbell County on a 3 year old Misdemeanor
warrant that he was trying to get taken care of for 30 months.
The point being he was brought here he didn't get any hygiene
products all they gave him was Mat, Blanket, Roll of toilet Paper
and that's all he had for 3 days. He told the guards everyday
and everyday he never got any hygiene ~~app~~ products until he
bucked up and he was also put into a misdemeanor cell
and he is a state inmate, Charles Brakenridge

To whom it does concern:

We, the inmates of the Campbell County Detention center are struggling to give voice to our complaints of the inhumane living conditions forced upon us. For the last two weeks in our particular cell, 221 there have been anywhere from 15 to 17 inmates at any given time. This is however, only an 8 man cell. Presently, there are nine men on the Floor Five without a stack-a-bunk or sheet and some without towel or washcloth. The toilet in our particular cell was broken from January 5 until March 24. When on the 22 of March the button had gone completely dead, leaving urine and feces indisposible, maintenance finally answered our constant pleas for help. Our personal laundry is supposed to be washed a minimum of once a week. When we are denied the opportunity to have laundry done, which is often, we are forced to wash our personals in our sink. Despite the cramped living space, we are rarely given the chance for recreation. We are also denied an opportunity to attend A.A. meetings, Church, and until recently, G.E.D. classes, which we thankfully

resolved. As for church or AA, I have not been offered the chance to attend either in the 3 months I have been here. We have no alternate means of voicing our complaints. Grievance forms seem nonexistent. Any grievance that is written on plain paper will not get past the guards. Our cell is full of mold causing many of the inmates to become ill. I myself have been sick twice since I have been here. When we sign the list to see the doctor however, we are prescribed medications without any form of examination. The ceiling in our cell is leaking water in two separate places. One inmate has even been to the hospital due to a slip and fall. These are just a few examples of the living conditions in this jail. Mostly, these are the complaints of just one cell. I am certain that upon further inspection one would discover that many of the cells share some if not all of the same problems. Any consideration given to this matter would be greatly appreciated. Thank you for your time and attention.

I am an inmate currently serving time in Newport County Jail. I am being subject to inhumane conditions. I am worried about my health and well being. I am in an eight man cell that is housing sixteen inmates. Many of us have no sheet on our mat. Our mat is on the concrete with no stock & Bunk. AT least 2 inmates are forced to bed less than 5 feet from the toilet. Our cell has not recieved a mop or broom in over a week. I inmates are being denied medical attention for multiple ailments including, but not limited to ~~open~~ exposed wounds and lacerations, contagious influenza and other airborne viruses. The food portions are leaving us malnourished. Our Recreation time is being denied without cause. There is no air circulation. Violence is constantly escalating due to the extreme over population. We are being charged \$5 per each ibuprofen and 40¢ per stamp. If possible can this message be relayed to the department of corrections. I am one of many state inmates being forced to live under these conditions.

P.O. whom it may concern,

We are inmates in the Campbell av. Detention Center. We are being treated & coraled like anything but human. The cells are double capacity of what they should be. We have no sheets on a lot of the mats, there are not enough stack-o-bunks for inmates. Therefore we (many) inmates are on the floor on mats for weeks at a time. Sleeping next to toilets is unsanitary, but is common in the cells of the C.C.D.C. We are left alone for hrs at a time without Co's checking for violence or injury to anyone. There are many inmates with sicknesses, Open sores. The food isn't enough to feed school kids much less full grown men. They bring. The staff do not provide adequate cleaning supplies. Seldom do we see disinfectants. The violence has risen due to the over crowdedness. There are no C.O.s to stop fights therefore people are being hurt. Bleeding all over open areas.
