

## **NATURE OF THE ACTION**

This is an action under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and Title I of the Civil Rights Act of 1991 to correct unlawful employment practices on the basis of sex and to provide appropriate relief to Janet C. Juelfs, who was subjected to sex-based discrimination, retaliation, and constructive discharge.

### **JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

- 1. Jurisdiction of this Court is invoked pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 451, 1331, 1337, 1343, and 1345. This action is authorized and instituted pursuant to Section 706(f)(1) and (3) of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, ("Title VII"), 42 U.S.C. § 2000e-5(f)(1) and (3), and Section 102 of the Civil Rights Act of 1991, 42 U.S.C. Sec. 1981a.
- 2. The employment practices alleged to be unlawful were and are now being committed within the jurisdiction of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas, Dallas Division.

#### **PARTIES**

- 3. Plaintiff, Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (the "Commission"), is an agency of the United States of America charged with the administration, interpretation and enforcement of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended and is expressly authorized to bring this action by Section 706(a) of Title VII, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e-5(a).
- 4. At all relevant times, Defendant, 24 Hour Fitness USA, Inc. has continuously been and is now doing business in the State of Texas and has continuously had at least fifteen employees.
- 5. At all relevant times, Defendant 24 Hour Fitness USA, Inc. has continuously been an employer engaged in an industry affecting commerce under Section 701(b), (g) and (h) of Title VII, 42 U.S.C. §2000e-(b), (g) and (h).

### **STATEMENT OF CLAIMS**

- 6. More than thirty days prior to the institution of this lawsuit, Janet C. Juelfs filed a charge with the Commission alleging violations of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, by the Defendant 24 Hour Fitness USA, Inc. All conditions precedent to the institution of this lawsuit have been fulfilled.
- 7. During the employment of Janet Juelfs the Defendant engaged in unlawful employment practices in violation of Section 703(a)(1) of Title VII, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e-2(a)(1) and Section 704(a) of Title VII, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e-3(a) by discriminating against Janet C. Juelfs on account of her sex, retaliating against her, and constructively discharging her. Specifically, 24 Hour Fitness USA, Inc. failed to promote her to the position of General Manager. When Ms. Juelfs was promoted to General Manager, she was subjected to different terms and conditions of

employment. When Ms. Juelfs complained of the discriminatory treatment she was demoted. The EEOC further claims that Janet Juelfs was constructively discharged from her employment.

- 8. The result of the foregoing practices has been to deprive Janet Juelfs of equal employment opportunities because of their sex.
- 9. The unlawful employment practices complained of in paragraph 7 above were intentional.
- 10. The unlawful employment practices complained of in paragraph 7 above were done with malice or with reckless indifference to the federally protected rights of Janet Juelfs.

#### PRAYER FOR RELIEF

Wherefore, the Commission respectfully requests that this Court:

- A. Grant a permanent injunction enjoining the Defendant 24 Hour Fitness USA, Inc., its officers, successors, assigns, and all persons in active concert or participation with it, from engaging in any employment practice which discriminates on the basis of sex.
- B. Order the Defendant to institute and carry out policies, practices, and programs which provide equal employment opportunities for all employees and which eradicate the effects of its past and present unlawful employment practices.
- C. Order the Defendant to make whole Janet Juelfs by providing appropriate back pay with prejudgment interest in amounts to be determined at trial, front pay, pecuniary losses, compensatory damages including out-of-pocket expenses, and other affirmative relief necessary to eradicate the effects of its unlawful employment practices.
- D. Order the Defendant to make Janet Juelfs whole by providing compensation for past and future pecuniary losses resulting from the unlawful employment practices described in

paragraph 7 above.

E. Order the Defendant to make Janet Juelfs whole by providing compensation for

past and future nonpecuniary losses resulting from the unlawful employment practices described

in paragraph 7 above, including but not limited to, pain and suffering, humiliation,

embarrassment, emotional distress, anxiety, and loss of enjoyment of life, in amounts to be

determined at trial.

F. Order the Defendant to pay Janet Juelfs punitive damages for its intentional,

malicious conduct or reckless indifference described in paragraph 7. above, in an amount to be

determined at trial.

G. Grant such further relief as the Court deems necessary and proper in the public

interest.

H. Award the Commission its costs in this action.

**JURY TRIAL DEMAND** 

The Commission requests a jury trial on all questions of fact raised by its Complaint.
