

ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF DISCOVERY CUTOFF DATE; OBJECTION TO CURRENT DEPOSITION SCHEDULE; and ORDER DENYING MOTION TO DISMISSAL WITHOUT PREJUDICE FOR LACK OF SUBJECT MATTER JURISDICTION OF THIRD-PARTY COMPLAINTS AGAINST THIRD-PARTY DEFENDANTS LOUKS

THIS MATTER comes before the court on the above-referenced motions (Dkt. ##54 & 60). The court is familiar with the records and files herein and documents filed in support of and in opposition to the motions.

The Motion for Extension of Discovery Cutoff should be denied. Discovery has already been extended once, and we are facing a trial date of 15 October with pretrial deadlines fast approaching. Furthermore, the court is not satisfied that the parties have met and conferred regarding discovery, nor is there any indication that a discovery plan involving Mr. Louks and his counsel have been considered or adopted. (See Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(f) and W. D. Wash. Local Rule 37.) While the court is concerned that there may have been discovery sessions set up without notice to the Louks' counsel, an extension of discovery without reference to specific, necessary discovery to be undertaken does not appear to the court to be an appropriate response.

The Motion for Dismissal should be denied for the reasons stated in the responses to the motion filed by counsel for the plaintiffs in intervention.

Therefore, it is now

ORDERED that the above-referenced motions are both hereby **DENIED**.

The Clerk of the Court is instructed to send uncertified copies of this Order to all counsel of record and to any party appearing *pro se* at said party's last known address.
