Intervenors for their Complaint against Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. allege:

- This is an action seeking damages and equitable relief for unlawful employment practices on the basis of retaliation and in violation of Title VII of the Civil Rights of 1964 and title I of the Civil Rights Act of 1991.
- 2. This Court has jurisdiction of this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§451, 1331, 1337, 1343 and 1345.
- 3. Venue is proper in the District of Arizona pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1391(b) as all acts occurred in this District.



- 4. The amounts in controversy exceed the minimum jurisdictional limits of this Court.
 - 5. At all material times hereto, Intervenors were residents of the State of Arizona.
- 6. At all material times hereto, Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. was a foreign corporation with continuous and systematic business contacts within the State of Arizona and has continuously had at least fifteen employees.
- 7. At all material times hereto, Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. has continuously been an employer in an industry affecting commerce within the meaning of Section 701(b), (g) and (h) of Title VII, 42 U.S.C. §§2000e(b), (g) and (h).
- 8. At all times material hereto, Intervenors were employed by Defendant HealthHelp, Inc.
- 9. During the time period of approximately May 2001, Intervenors were informed by Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. that they were not to hire "Blacks or Jews" for a client in Oregon.
- 10. Intervenors informed Defendant HealthHelp, Inc.'s human resources department of the facts set forth in paragraph 8 and further informed the human resources department that they would not participate in such a discriminatory practice that violates federal law.
- 11. Subsequent to Intervenors complaining of the acts set forth in paragraph 8 and after informing the human resources department that they would not participate in such a discriminatory practice that violates federal law, Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. retaliated against Intervenors and said retaliation culminated in Intervenors being terminated in June, 2001.
- 12. The acts of Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. as set forth in the preceding paragraphs constitute a violation of Title VII of the Civil Rights of 1964 and title I of the Civil Rights Act of 1991.

The acts of Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. as set forth in the preceding paragraphs 13. were intentional and committed with malice and reckless indifference to the federally protected rights of Intervenors. WHEREFORE, Intervenors respectfully request this Court to: Issue a judgment declaring that the conduct of Defendant HealthHelp, Inc., as set forth herein, violated Intervenors' rights pursuant to Title VII of the Civil Rights of 1964 and title I of the Civil Rights Act of 1991. Issue preliminary and permanent injunctions against Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. B. prohibiting it from committing similar unlawful acts in the future. C. Issue a judgment awarding Intervenors compensatory damages against Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. in an amount to be determined at trial. D. Issue a judgment awarding Intervenors punitive damages against Defendant HealthHelp, Inc. in an amount to be determined at trial. E. Issue a judgment awarding Intervenors their reasonable costs and attorneys fees pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §1988 and any other applicable law.

Issue a judgment awarding Intervenors all other relief that is just and F. appropriate under the circumstances.

Intervenors demand a trial by jury. G.
